The meeting was opened at 6PM with the Serenity Prayer. District representatives present were Mike B, Shawn C, Al C. Also present were Jerome D, Ralph P, and Delphine H. The last meetings minutes were reviewed and accepted.

BUSINESS - 1. Reviewed special meeting with the "New Frontiers" Committee. No specific conclusions.

2. After much discussion those present recommend that Central Committee form an Ad Hoc Committee to consist of representative who are members of the current district to re-evaluate, assign, etc, and improve the group distribution into districts by location, adding new districts if deemed necessary.
