

Wanted to Know about
Central Office But Forgot to
Ask.

Even though we've been around for 72 years, an amazing number of people claim they know nothing about Central Office. Just for you, here is a Central Office clip-and-save Q&A that answers your most frequently asked questions about the office.

THE OFFICE

What does Central Office do?

Central Office (officially A.A. on the Niagara Frontier) is a one-stop service office that helps A.A. groups in Buffalo, WNY Area do the jobs that no one group can do alone. These jobs include publishing the meeting directory, operating the telephone service, distributing 12-step calls, maintaining the website, publishing the New Frontiers, and selling A.A. World Service publications to groups and individuals. Those are the office's main jobs—there are a lot of others.

Where is the office?

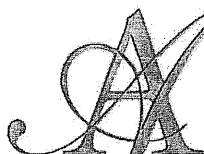

When are you open?

The office is open 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m., reopens 2:00 PM to 4:30 pm. every weekday.

Who works at Central Office?

Tradition Eight allows A.A. to employ special workers for our service centers. Central Office is a service center, so it has one-paid workers, Terry B., the Executive Secretary. Volunteers from A.A. groups throughout the area are always welcome.



THE NEW FRONTIERS

Our newsletter, the *New Frontiers*, is available to any A.A. member by subscription for \$10 per year. They are also supplied at The Central Committee meeting, the first Sunday of every month. There's a subscription form in each issue of the newsletter, or you can pick one up at the office.

My group wants to list its Anniversary's in the New Frontiers.

How do we do that?

You can send in your anniversary lists, obituaries, event listings, and miscellaneous items via e-mail, fax, regular mail, or in person. The important thing is the deadline. That deadline is no later than the 12th day of the month before you want the item published. If you want to get something in the November Messenger, get it to Terry by the 12th of October. For the December issue, turn in your news by the 12th of November, and so on. We welcome any group news, so send it on in!

My group wants to get a flyer in the New Frontiers. How do we do that?

You must supply the flyers, 450 for the group mailing only or 800 for all New Frontiers printed. There is also a \$25.00 mailing charge. We must receive it also by the 12th of the month prior also.

Can I write an article for the New Frontiers?

Yes, please do. Try to get longer articles in by the first of the month.

THE MEETING DIRECTORY

The Buffalo/Niagara Frontier meeting directory is available free on our website or in print format for 50 cents. Changes are listed in the next New Frontiers published after we get the change.

How often does the directory come out?

The printed directory comes out 2 times a year.

How do I get my group listed in the directory?

We have guidelines that must be filled out by new groups. After the paper work is received back, it is put in the bulletin section of the New Frontiers. 3 Months after they are received back they are voted on at Central Committee. After the vote they are placed in the next schedule. Changes have to be written and we have to have a contact person listed so we won't make mistakes. Come to the office and fill out a form telling us

the name of the group, the meeting place, the meeting times, the meeting types and whether or not your meeting is wheelchair accessible. The same information goes for changes in meeting times and places.

THE STORE

Intergroup policy is for the office to sell A.A. conference approved literature, Grapevine items, the 24 hr Book, Little Red Book and medallions & pins only. That means we do not sell gift items, like jewelry and t-shirts.

Do you have a price list?

Yes. You can get a copy at the office.

Do you take credit cards?

No. We take checks and cash only right now.

Can I charge?

Only groups can charge. All monies are due within 30 day's.

Can I use e-mail to order?

Yes. If you are ordering for a group, send your shopping list to buffaloaa@hotmail.com and your order will be charged to the group and be waiting for you to pick up. If you are ordering for yourself, let us know if you are going to pay by cash or check and include a phone number so we can make the invoice right.

Will you ship my order to me?

Yes. We charge 10% of the total purchase for shipping and handling, with a minimum of \$3.95. We ship via the U.S. post office.

If my group has a charge account, when are bills due?

Your bill is due within 30 days of the transaction. When the office re-orders stock, we have to include a check for the full amount with our order. We use the money you pay us to back that check. When you pay the office on time, we can order stock more frequently so we don't run out.

THE INTERGROUP

The A.A. on the Niagara Frontier Central Committee runs the office. It is composed of representatives from every group in our area that wants to send one and it meets at 7:00 p.m. on the first Sunday of every month. A Steering Committee, composed of the Central Committee Chair, Co-chair, Financial Chair, Executive Secretary, and the 8 distinct representatives guides the Central Committee.

When does Central Committee meet?

I know we've already answered that, but everyone always forgets. Central Committee meets in the Central Office conference room at 7:00 p.m. on the first Sunday of every month.

How do I get to be in Central Committee?

Some groups have formal elections, but at most groups, all you need to do is volunteer at your business meeting and show up at the next Intergroup meeting. Serving on

From the Archives: AA's First International Convention

By 1950, AA had grown a lot. It had spread into many countries, gotten an official newsletter, and been recognized by the American press. It had truly gone international, without heavy promotion or outside investments, by the same miracle that started it all: one drunk talking to another, now with the help of the Big Book. Bill saw that it would outlive its founders, with some help.

He had been working on the Twelve Traditions, suggestions for how AA groups would operate, since the mid-1940s. They were more or less complete in a short time, as "Twelve Points to Assure Our Future," but the fellowship itself took longer to work on. He was committed to getting them approved by AA, rather than using his personality to push them through. The three years before the convention he spent among the groups, presenting his vision. He found plenty of resistance along the way, including some from Dr. Bob. Their friendship never faltered, but Dr Bob's health had in the late 1940s. That, plus his prudence, kept him from approving the Traditions until the conference in Cleveland, where everyone else present did, as well. On Saturday, July 28th, to a crowd of thousands of AA members, Bill presented the Traditions for a standing vote, and any remaining resistance faded away. Every member present stood, in a beautiful show of unity ("Pass It On").

Both of the co-founders spoke the next day. Dr Bob's talk would be his last, short because of his physical weakness, but full of helpful suggestions that, with the Traditions, continue to guide the fellowship today. He suggested keeping the program simple, just as he would in his last words to Bill, later that year. In that same speech, he simplified the program by boiling it down to two words, love and service. He also reminded us to "guard that erring member, the tongue," and to keep taking time to help "our less fortunate brothers," like he had done thousands of times in the last 15 years. He was too weak from speaking to stay on the stage after that, but his words remain ("Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers").

In the photo of Bill with other AA members before the convention, it takes a second to pick out our co-founder. Though he sits at the center of the group, he blends into it. All of them look dignified in suits and ties, and all seem to have the same earnestness, the same sense of purpose, in their eyes. They are united by the same mission that unites us today, because of the Traditions: to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. That weekend, they were assuring AA's future, and ours (area63aa.org).

BUFFALO CENTRAL COMMITTEE MINUTES

June 1, 2014

Sean R. Chair opened the meeting at 7:05 PM with a moment of silence and the Serenity Prayer. Kristen (Three Legacies) read the Preamble, Randy (Carry the Message) read the Purpose of Central Committee, Jeremiah (Giving Group) read the Twelve Traditions. Refreshments were provided by the WE group (next month they will be provided by the Brass group). A motion was made to adopt the April minutes by Pat (Thruway) and seconded by Alan (Brass). New groups were greeted and 24 groups were represented: Zone #1: Giving Group Zone #2: Brass, North Buffalo, Renaissance, Three Legacies. Zone # 3: Abbott Men's, Buffalo, Courage, Iron Horse, Ridge, Sober Saturday, Thruway. Zone #4: Arcade Zone #5: Lockport #1, Simplicity. Zone #6: Carry the Message, Lakeshore, Sobriety Men's Discussion, WE - Women's Experience. Zone #7: Fresh Start Zone #8: Achievement, Beginnings – Womens, East Amherst Traditions, Midnight Discussion, Williamsville, Women Making the Effort

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

•**ENVELOPE SYSTEM:** We received \$912 donation in May. In response to the letters I had out last month, we received two donations from previous donors. I have, to date, not received notice of any new donors. Please contact me at 716-341-7020 if you would like me to come to discuss the benefits of the envelope system with your group. Or if you would like to donate. Thank You Thank you; Sue B, Envelope System Chair

•**STEERING COMMITTEE:** - Reps from zones 1, 2, 7 & 8 were in attendance. We did not have a quorum, so we discussed executive secretary review.

•**FINANCIAL REPORT:**

Total Income: \$6,996. Literature sales were average. Individual contributions via the envelope system were over \$900, well over our average \$300 per month. Group contributions are way down compared to prior months. Thank you to the individuals and groups who are supporting AA in WNY!!

Total Expenses: \$6,829, which is an average month.

Monthly Net: Income of \$137, which brings us to an income of \$1,392 since January. The current Checking Account balance is \$24,512.25. Petty Cash is at \$3,000. Our Prudent Reserve is the same as the prior month, with a balance of \$23,124.16. Books and literature ready for sale total 12,247.89, the lowest total so far this year but within our normal range.

Corrections Facilities: Current Balance is \$1,800.42, higher than last month, due to no expenses for May. Contributions were \$220.

Treatment Committee: Current Balance is \$878.05, a small amount lower than April. Contributions were \$225 & expenses were \$243.

Group Accounts Receivable: \$711, lower than last month. There are 6 groups in the current to 30 day range with a total of \$505. There are 4 groups in the 30 and over range with a total of \$206.

Other: Due to the Executive Secretary being off and the timing of month end, I have not verified bank balances as of this time for the month, which is part of the Financial Secretary's position. This will be done in the coming week.

•**TREATMENT:** June Treatment Committee Report

There were 14 people in attendance at our last treatment facility committee meeting and 9 groups were represented. We have added a new bin with literature at the Salvation Army meeting and updated the meeting format. We also attended the Midnight meeting's special anniversary meeting.

We are working on starting two new meetings: 1) ECMC detox/rehab meeting on Tuesday at 6pm. We have two groups that have volunteered, but we need 7 more. Please consider contacting us if your group would like to participate. 2) Speaker meeting at the 291 Elm treatment facility. We are still in the process of arranging a date and time for this meeting.

We are very thankful for the many groups that support treatment in this area. If you would like to help with treatment you could come to our monthly meetings on the 3rd Monday of the month at 6 pm at Central Committee (next three meetings: 6/16, 7/21, 8/18). If your group would like to bring a meeting into at treatment facility please call me at (716) 867-0560 and we can speak to your group at your next business meeting. We are a financially autonomous group and greatly appreciate all donations, which can be made to Central Office with a memo titled "Treatment Facility donation". Donated funds go to buying literature for people in the treatment facilities.

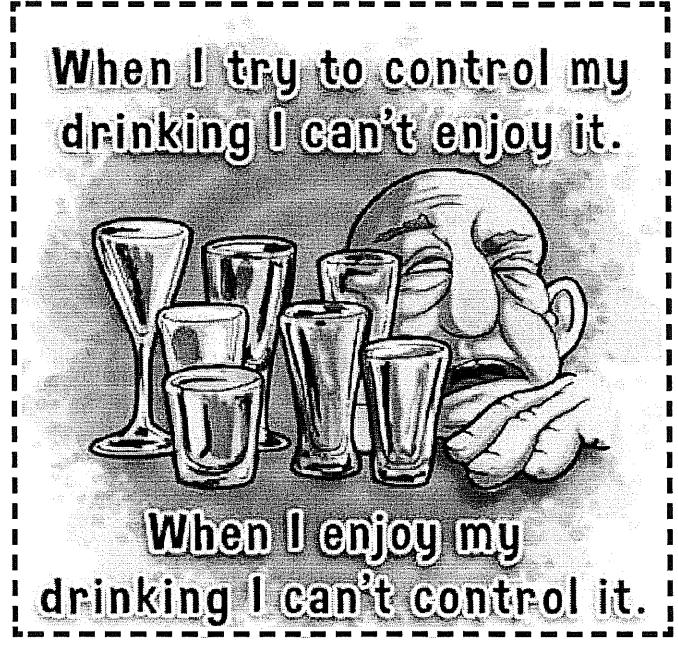
