Tradition Three: "The Only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking." The Only Requirement ~~~ A Timely Reminder of Our Primary Purpose

ARE YOU a member of AA if you say you are? Not necessarily! Our Third Tradition states: "The only requirement for AA membership is a desire to stop drinking." The last four words of this Tradition suggest that there *is* a definite requirement, in that there must be problem drinking involved.

All of us know members who suffered from both alcoholism and drug addiction. These people have always been welcome as long as alcohol is the primary problem. Any reference to pills or other drugs, except as it relates to the alcoholic problem, has no place in AA meetings.

Many of our newer members coming from treatment centers to AA find our Third Tradition difficult to understand. They say that as patients of the centers they attended AA meetings along with people addicted to pills or other drugs, and that they were told by doctors and counselors that "a drug is a drug is a drug," that alcohol was their "drug of choice," and that they were "addicted to the drug alcohol." For the most part, they seem sincere in their bewilderment and would probably accept a logical statement explaining why

their nonalcoholic, drug- or pill-addicted friends are not accepted as members in AA.

About this time, however, some well-meaning but uninformed member will interrupt with a quotation from Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions: "When in doubt, ask yourself, 'What would the Master do?' " There be but one answer: The Master a program for the ills of all mankind; Alcoholics Anonymous has a program only for the ills of alcoholics! The Big Book says we suffered from a disease known as alcoholism, not addiction to the drug alcohol. Our Preamble makes it clear that "our primary purpose is to stay sober [abstain from alcohol] and help other alcoholics [non-alcoholics are not mentioned] to achieve sobriety." AA is a fellowship that specializes in alcoholism-recovery assistance only, and if it should begin to lose its ability to specialize by branching out into other areas, it would thereby lose its effectiveness.

Lo and behold...it was still snowing as we were leaving the parish center on the Hill. The 4:00pm Children's Mass was a pure delight reflecting the staff and students labor of love, their repetitive practices throughout the fall and winter season. We were especially pleased to celebrate the Christmas Eve vigil Mass with our granddaughter being an enthusiastic participant in the children's choir. With a brief stop home to pick up food and gifts we prepared to drive over for a grand family reunion with the brothers, cousins and all their children. Dinner and the present exchange had been anticipated ever since the boys discussed it prior to the recent Thanksgiving holiday.

Considering the apparent intensity of the snowfall I decided to take our Jeep 4x4...just in case as I was uncertain about the capability of our Van to negotiate what the weatherman was predicting that evening. After much planning and budget stretching the extended family was finally able to enjoy the marvelous table of food and libation spread out in the dining room. All being well fed by the elaborate table, we adjourned to watch with pleasure as the children dove into the gifts surrounding the immense tree in the great room. I felt a resounding sense of gratitude and undeserved joy for such a large and loving family reflected in the screeching and hilarity of the children-cousins when opening present after present from family members and Santa Clause.

As the evening grew into night and as the celebratory tumult continued I naggingly reminded myself of the commitment I made earlier in the month to chair the meeting at the Home Group this evening. Looking out the great room windows the snow fall seemed to be more intense and cumulative by the moment. The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak...seemed to apply as it has in so much of my life. Certainly no one would even think of going to a meeting in this weather! I debated with myself and the absurd and hasty commitment I made several weeks ago in our business meeting. What an idiot...only a fool would journey out this evening...it is so snug safe and sound here with the family ...what difference will it make if I just forget about it. Eventually I gathered up my courage and frail self discipline, deciding to at least go and wait around the Potter House for a few minutes, planning to return to the family's house party when no one shows up.

Driving the Jeep 4x4 through deep drifts and 2ft + snowfall, I realized this being Christmas Eve the plows were not out on the road yet. My Jeep ground through the drifts cascading snow over and across the engine hood...thank God for 4 wheel drive, winter blades and a good heater. I felt like the caretaker in "The Shining" tracking through a blizzard. Finally arriving at the Meeting, I found it dark and shuttered. I opened the front door and went in to sit and wait for any activity. Several minutes passed in silence causing me to reassess my presence of mind and reason for my being here. I pulled out the coffee maker and set up several chairs with the Big Book on the coffee table finally listening to the groaning of the pot...silence. Several prayers and Big Book paragraphs later there was a stirring at the front door. A member of the fellowship trudged the drifts from home and was coming up the stairs. Startled, I explained no one was here and I was planning to close up. The member suggested we have our own meeting as ...where two or more of you are gathered...I was somewhat take aback but... why not. We opened the meeting in the usual fashion and shared on a topic of immediate concern. The member had been distressed and anxious about an emergent family issue. As we talked, listened and prayed with each other applying the program's spiritual principles it was apparent the stress had resolved from our midst. There was a growing calm and reassurance that for the moment trust had been established in the unfolding of a Divine plan for our private lives. We concluded the meeting with The Lords Prayer, put away the coffee urn, equipment, pamphlets and books, secured the building and bid each other a Merry Christmas. Driving back to my daughter's house with the radio off I was able to reflect upon what just transpired this evening. I made a commitment earlier in the month never imagining that I would be used by God to be an instrument of His peace, to be a listening ear to the difficulty of another, to be a conduit of stability for the needs of a fellow, to be dependable in making meetings available, no matter what the circumstances. I had an enhanced feeling of self worth, a realization in a small way of fulfilling my purpose in life, a sense of doing God's will and having a sense of harmony with a spiritual dimension. Being of service to others in need grants me a precious gift of fulfillment and purpose. Despite society enveloping us in seasonal, worldliness and materialism we have the program offering us a spiritual gift of internal peace from our higher power. My gratitude can be readily demonstrated through service to those in need.



From the Archives: Living to Serve

On March 3, 1947, Nell Wing walked into the office of the Alcoholic Foundation, in Manhattan. She wasn't planning on working there long. All she needed was enough money to head to Mexico and pursue her dream of studying sculpture. After spending two years in the Coast Guard, she didn't have enough saved up to get there.

This job hadn't even seemed like a great one, either; the girl at the employment office had asked if she wanted to work "for Alcoholics Anonymous" in a lowered voice, like she was sharing a shameful secret. But Nell felt excited about it for some reason, drawn to it, at least as a source of quick money. She came ready to get to work, and ready to leave soon after that.

On her first day, she must have felt a lot of different things. She might have noticed that the office, on Lexington Avenue, was right by Grand Central Station. She might have felt a surge of excitement at heading off soon, like those commuters, into what might have felt like her destiny. But, if she did, she probably forgot all of that after spending half a day in the office, which could be summed up in one word: "chaos" (Gail L., "Nell Wing: GSO's First Archivist").

The office staff had been a group of "freewheeling," defiant alcoholics who had quit after an office manager had been brought in to whip them into shape (Nell Wing, Grapevine article). Even a competent staff seemed crammed into those three small rooms—there were "3 AA secretaries, a bookkeeper, shipping clerk, file and records clerk, two typists, two stenos, office manager, and Bill" (Gail L.). A.A. was only 12 years old, and growing tremendously. They didn't need temporary workers; they needed servants. She dove in. And she stayed for the rest of her life.

What makes a person who isn't alcoholic dedicate his or her life to serving A.A., like Nell did? She worked as secretary for a number of years, then became Bill's assistant, and finally ended up as A.A.'s first archivist, making A.A. her family, never marrying to have one of her own. Is it the same power that drove Sister Ignatia, who also had artistic ambitions, and also ended up devoting all of that energy to helping alcoholics, plus the energy of love that many devote to their kids? Why serve us?

Maybe the reason can be found in what she saw on that first day: an urgent need, bigger than her own need for money. There's another possibility, too. In a tribute written after her passing in 2007, Mel B. quotes her saying that, from the start, she was "caught by the A.A. Fellowship," with its "caring," "not so much a general 'caring for our fellowman,' but a one-on-one caring, a love for one another."

Maybe what she saw was the First Tradition at work, even before it was written: the "we" is more important than the "I." That's how we recover, and she helped that happen for so many during her life. Her example keeps it happening, and will as long as A.A. lives. ~~~~ Chad P.

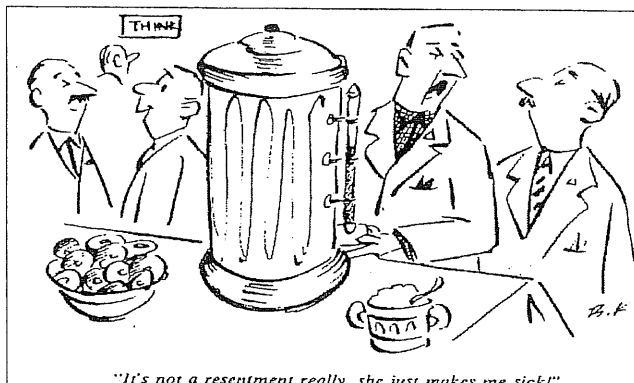

•**FINANCIAL REPORT:** Report for January 2014

Total Income: \$10,251.52. Group contributions 6% above monthly average, thank you. Envelope system almost double the monthly average, literature sales slightly below average.

Total Expenses: \$14,659.45 above average. Payroll related expenses higher because 3 payments (2 week per pay period) hit in January. Liability insurance is an annual expense, paid this month. Literature expenses higher because of an order for 75th Anniversary Big Books, which the Executive Secretary will review. 2014 Schedules were received & paid for.

Monthly Net: Loss of \$4,407.93 The current Checking Account balance is \$18,712.15, our Prudent Reserve is \$23,120.36

Corrections Committee: Current Balance is \$1,666.73, with contributions of 593.88 & expenses of \$425.15. Good to see some activity.

Treatment Committee: Current Balance is \$974.01, with contributions of \$166.05 & expenses of \$3.00. I assume we will see some spending in the future as this committee continues to "ramp up" meetings we host.

Group Accounts Receivable: \$1,157.69. None over 60 days, 3 groups in the 31-60 days with a total of \$320.54. Two groups are at break-even levels & we work with them, the 3rd is sending a payment. All groups that have receivables are established and/or have contributed to CC in the past.

Our financial situation isn't looking so good and we will not be able to continue to buy literature for newcomers in treatment programs if we don't get help. If I'm asking for the knowledge of God's Will for me, how can I claim what that is? How can I know what "the next right thing" Is for me to do? This is a spin that came into the rooms from contact with the rehabs. It sounded good. We used to say that "we pray and put one foot in front of the other." I don't know what is right for me or what is not! When we ask for the knowledge of God's Will and just put one foot in front of the other it is because only God knows what is "the next right thing!"

When we open the meeting we read the Twelve Promises. These are the precious gift of taking these steps. Newcomers listen as they are wondering if they are in the right place. Some worry that this a religious event or worse a cult. When the reader asks "Are these extravagant promises?" Many members now yell "We think not!" It has become a sort of chant! It's like a response to a Preacher. For some now the chant is "Hell no!", "maybe!", "Don't know," and even "yes!" What a sad impression this gives!

When I was in early sobriety these kinds of changes would not have been ignored. They would have been addressed immediately ...and probably at a business meeting or likely a beginners table. Have we gotten soft? Some of us with long sobriety don't come to these tables often enough, how is the message going to be carried? We need the whole group to spare us from these subtle erosions in our meetings.
