4. Do I help my group in every way I can to fulfill our primary purpose?
5. Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer? Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?

## **TEACHER, SPONSOR AND FRIEND**

It is said that newcomers must be teachable. If that is true, then we must have teachers. As teachers, we offer our knowledge and past experiences to help our newcomers overcome their difficulties early in their recovery. I learned much from newcomers and old-timers alike; they have so much to share. We concentrate on our future but always keep the haunting memories of our past transgressions fresh in our minds. If we accept the behavior of our alcoholism then we must also accept its consequences. Sobriety is within everyone's grasp, the Twelve Suggested Steps pave the highway to sobriety and our road to recovery. We learn that we cannot do this alone and we must ask for help, get humble and give up on our way of thinking. Sounds simple doesn't it! But it's a struggle early in our recovery.

A teacher can be a sponsor as well as a good friend, one who will listen to our horror stories and offer us some hope. He or she will guide us through the 12 steps and the challenging days of early sobriety, by sharing their stories of recovery with us. This practice is the miracle of AA, one member sharing with another.

Whether you are young or not so young, most of us can adapt to this new way of life, and achieve sobriety with just a spark of willingness. Those of us who enjoy this blessed gift of sobriety today can thank the teachers of the past and those grizzled and wonderfully patient old-timers who shook our hands and offered us hope. Sponsors don't get people sober, they simply share their experience, strength and hope with the sponsee and make suggestions, then let the newcomer make his or her own decisions. My sponsor didn't tell me what to do; he showed me what to do by virtue of his experiences.

The newcomers come to us today all shined and polished! Not like the raggedy homeless and unemployable people we were. The rehab gibberish permeates some beginner's tables, with the "my counselor told me" as the main topic. Make no mistake, rehabs save lives, but when we accept the AA way of life, let's start talking and living AA principles. As teachers and moderators we need to be specific about table topics and stick to an AA related topic.

Now recovery begins. Newcomers need to take action and become a part of this fellowship and not as spectators sitting back hoping something will happen. Action is the magic word. Join a Group, and take part in your own recovery, one day at a time. Still confused? Give up and find a Power Greater Than Yourself, prayer works. Try it!

## WHAT IS THE 13<sup>th</sup> STEP

For those new to the fellowship, you may occasionally hear reference to the “13th Step”... It is AA slang for when a member (male or female) with a period of recovery (usually over a year) pursues and/or seduces a newcomer (male or female) by way of offering guidance on the program, when their interests are not purely altruistic. This is not to be confused with members with individual foundations in recovery beginning a relationship. From the Twelve and Twelve on the difference – “The prospective partners need to be solid A.A.s and long enough acquainted to know that their compatibility at spiritual, mental and emotional levels is a fact and not wishful thinking. They need to be as sure as possible that no deep under-lying emotional handicap in either will be likely to rise up under later pressures to cripple them.”

Let's see what our Big Book has to say on the subject. "We reviewed our own conduct over the years past. Where had we been selfish, dishonest or inconsiderate? Whom had we hurt? We subjected each relation to the test--was it selfish or not? "In this was we tried to shape a sane and sound ideal for our future sex life." I was told if I wanted to "meet" someone I should talk to my sponsor about it first and if I'm afraid to take it to my sponsor then it is probably selfish and driven by my uncanny ability to justify and rationalize pursuing what I want at the moment.

The 12 and 12 within our Traditions clearly states "...he (she) learns that the clamor of desires and ambitions within him (her) must be silenced whenever these could damage the group." In my experience there is nothing more damaging to an AA group than a slick 13th stepper. Unity, the guiding principle in our groups, dictates that as a group it is up to us to protect our newcomers. Not by self-righteous gossip, but by the sharing of known facts we know through experience or simple observations. No one, unless he or she is unduly disruptive or violent would ever be escorted out of a meeting of AA, nor would any of us want them to be. No matter what our "outside issues" may be, we wish for each of us to have that "vital spiritual experience".

Most of us come to AA pretty sick in the area of sex relations. However, as the Book states, "If we are not sorry, and our conduct continues to harm others, we are quite sure to drink. We are not theorizing. These are the facts out of our experience." Without alcohol to comfort us we often look for other solutions or distractions but working the steps with a sponsor makes us realize we have no more excuses for our behavior. We are responsible, not only for our sobriety, but to the individuals within our group who give us that precious gift. We cannot treat an AA meeting like another barroom. Our HP will change us if we desire that change and are willing to do the work. Wayne B. from California says it from the podium best. When he closes he says "If you are a woman with less than a couple of years of sobriety and I come up to you after the meeting and say, "Hey, let's get a cup of coffee...and talk about God."-**RUN!**

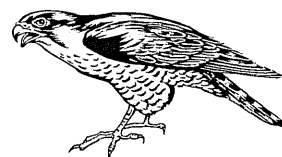

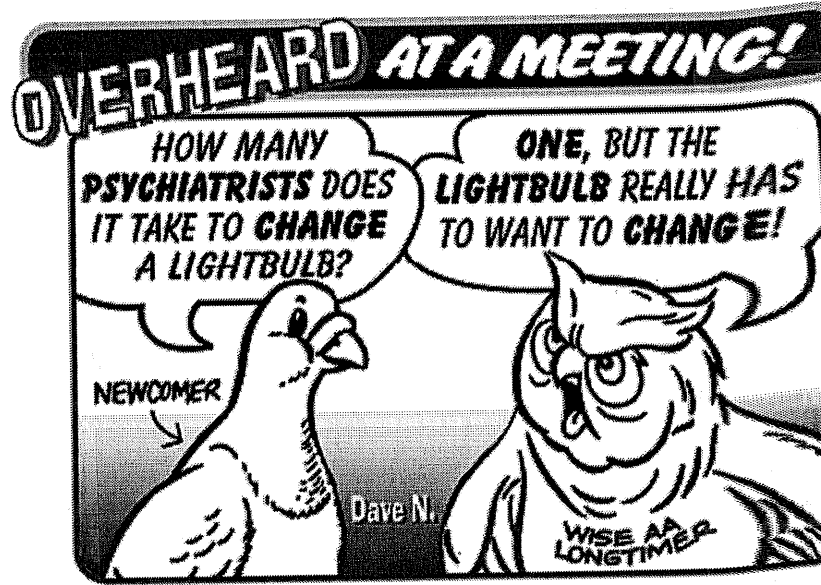
