A Past Participle ...

"Continued to take moral [personal] inventory and when we were wrong, promptly admitted it."

Notice that the word "continued" is a past participle. We take it to mean that this Step is an unvarying and unceasing thing. It is a part of the program that must be repeated day by day. It is also a reminder that the program is a living thing—a way of growing.

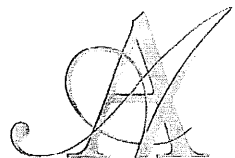
Remember how hard it was to accomplish the 4th Step—the first moral inventory? Many of us finally got around to make it. When we finished, we felt a lot better. At least our own slate was wiped clean. But some of us let the matter end there. The 10th Step serves to warn that the inventory process—begun in the 4th Step—is only a beginning.

Now let's look at the rest of the Step. "When we were wrong, we promptly admitted it" is another of those easy-to-say but hard-to-do things. Most of us are fairly egocentric; it is part of the illness. In our personal relations, it's a bit harder for us to admit that we were wrong about anything. Early in our sobriety, especially when we were still in the remorse stage, we went overboard on this matter. It gave some of us a sort of pleasure to admit that we were stinkers; that we were going to do better. Are you still feeling the same way?

There are several sound reasons for the 10th Step. In the first place, no alcoholic can afford to nurse resentments. If we know we are wrong about something and do not admit it, we are likely to start building a nest for resentments. In the second place, none of us can afford to be dishonest. We believe that it is dishonest to "think wet and talk dry". We believe it is dishonest to "get by with something" at the expense of someone else. When we are wrong and fail to admit it—even to ourselves—we are back in the old drinking state of mind—dishonest, phony, stubborn and arrogant.

But enough of this preaching. The really important thing is the effect this 10th Step will have on you. It will make you happier, kinder, more serene. We know a number of A.A.s who practice this Step in their lives. We envy them because they have peace of mind.

Start practicing the 10th Step now. It's a principle of living that can be used everywhere. Begin at home and then carry it to your office. You will be surprised how startled—and pleased—your friends will be when you start taking your share of the blame!



On Celebrating One Year:

This program of A.A. and fellowship has been such a blessing in my life. Never could I imagine a year sober (when I couldn't get a day). But I gave it all up and I prayed and He answered, with the help of a sponsor who is someone I admire and want to be like. She has shared her experience, strength and hope with me, and guided me in working the Steps. And through all the pain, regret and grief I have been able to find salvation, a way out. God empowers me every day. I have changed so much of my life and I give it all to Him. Today I have blessings no one can take away. My children are with me every day and every night. My life is awesome with them in it. We have all struggled because of my addiction, and I just want to say I'm proud of the young adults you've become. I love you guys. I know I'm a better mom today because God guides me. I was able to make amends to my family who are now in my life, especially my mother, who I couldn't even speak to. Her exact words, in church after Mass, were "If God can forgive you, I can too." And from there the walls were broken down and a relationship blossomed. With her help I am working toward getting custody of my children back. I am someone my children can come to now for love, guidance and understanding. I do everything a mom is supposed to do. And with God's help and A.A. I am able to live a better life without drinking. I have a wonderful partner who found me again, and loved me and my children and everything I came with unconditionally. He has supported me getting to meetings and in caring for the kids and their needs. And, of course, I have this BROTHER. He brought me to my first A.A. meeting here at Iron Horse. He's such a role model. And even though he's my little brother, he's "BIG" to me. You are my hero! I made Iron Horse my home group because I felt acceptance here. I came early and got to know and talk to you guys. I helped make coffee and after a while I stood at the door and greeted. I'm not going to forget, nor neglect, what I got from here. There are people in this program who helped me without asking for anything in return. They guided me and gave me HOPE. And one day at a time I was able to get sober. I know with A.A. and God I cannot fail. And each one of you has shown me that I don't have to do this alone. I may not do this perfectly. I may cry a lot, as you all know. My life isn't always manageable. My kids may drive me crazy at times. But I don't have to drink over it today! I pray a lot and wait for "the miracle to unfold" as it has already started doing in my life. Why else would I be here?

Now most alkie's think that the 9th step promises are what we are shooting for in the practice of all the steps, but Tex pointed out 31 promises in the Step 10 portion of the Big Book on pages 84 and 85. (See if you can find them.) You know, the "if you want what we got, then we suggest you take 12 Steps" bit...

Step 10 tells me what they got as a result of learning to apply the steps to their lives, and the results I would get if I was diligent in my efforts. The promise on lines 8 and 9 of page 85 made it worth my while to follow the instructions given, because that is what I wanted more than anything, to get the monkey of that incessant craving and compulsion off my back and out of my mind, so that I could quit living in fear.

I found that as a result of diligent practice of the 10th every day, that my character defects quickly became damned obvious on a daily basis. It was not a problem listing them and seeing them in my 4th step, and each day brought more clarity for the causes of the defects, the "root causes and conditions," and a whole lot of clarity and understanding of the second half of the 1st step, about those things besides my boozing that I had carefully reserved for "my own management."

This Month in A.A. ~ Bob D.

By October of 1970 the health of Alcoholics Anonymous co-founder Bill Wilson had taken a decided turn for the worse. His emphysema had gone acute. As much as Bill relished attending A.A. functions and sharing his experience, strength and hope, his physical limitations made it impossible for him to attend the October 10th gathering at the New York Hilton at which his sobriety anniversary would be celebrated.

Instead, Bill was represented by his wife Lois, who carried with her Bill's greetings to the gathering of some 2,200 A.A. members. It went as follows:

"Recently an A.A. member sent me an unusual greeting which I would like to extend to you. He told me it was an ancient Arabian salutation. Perhaps we have no Arabian groups, but it still seems a fitting expression of how I feel for each of you. It says, "I salute you and thank you for your life."

My thoughts are much occupied these days with gratitude to our Fellowship and for the myriad blessings bestowed upon us by God's Grace.

If I were asked which of these blessings I felt was most responsible for our growth as a fellowship and most vital to our continuity, I would say, the "Concept of Anonymity."

Anonymity has two attributes essential to our individual and collective survival; the spiritual and the practical. On the spiritual level, anonymity demands the greatest discipline of which we are capable; on the practical level, anonymity has brought protection for the newcomer, respect and support of the world outside, and security from those of us who would use A.A. for sick and selfish purposes.

A.A. must and will continue to change with the passing years. We cannot, nor should we, turn back the clock. However, I deeply believe that the principle of anonymity must remain our primary and enduring safeguard. As long as we accept our sobriety in our traditional spirit of anonymity we will continue to receive God's Grace. And so—once more, I salute you in that spirit and again I thank you for your lives.

May God bless us all now, and forever.

How interesting it is that Bill stressed the topic of anonymity as he neared death (he would pass three months later). He didn't reiterate the inherent power of the 12 Steps, or the need to maintain a vibrant spiritual connection with a Higher Power to sustain the cherished gift of sobriety. Perhaps he deduced that by this time—more than 30 years since the birth of A.A.—the solution to alcoholism had been made self-evident through the example of thousands of recovered and recovering alcoholics. "If you want what we have and are willing to go to any length to get it ..."

Maybe Bill stressed the topic of anonymity because he realized that upon his death his life and Alcoholic Anonymous would again be publicly connected, this time through the widespread publication of his obituary. Would not it have been easy for other A.A. members to conclude, perhaps because of creeping jealousy or envy, that there's no harm in trumpeting one's association with the fellowship? What trouble could this possibly cause? Look at Bill. Everyone knows who he is.

But as Bill noted, anonymity serves a dual purpose. It enables newcomers to walk into their first meeting with a hope that Alcoholics Anonymous is as the name suggests and that their dire search for a solution to the drink needn't become a matter for public consumption.

As for the spiritual side, is there not a discipline and a humility in being, publicly speaking, a silent member of an expansive and successful group? After all, no one of us is proof that A.A. works. It's the whole lot of us that stand as a demonstration of its power.



Editorial: On the 10th Tradition

“No A.A. Group or member should ever, in such a way as to implicate A.A., express any opinion on outside controversial issues—particularly those of politics, alcohol reform, or sectarian religion. The Alcoholics Anonymous Groups oppose no one. Concerning such matters they can express no views whatever.”

To most of us, Alcoholics Anonymous has become as solid as the Rock of Gibraltar. We like to believe that it will soon be as well known and just as enduring as that historic landmark. We enjoy this pleasant conviction because nothing has yet occurred to disturb it; we reason that we must hang together or die. Hence we take for granted our continued unity as a movement.

But should we? Though God has bestowed upon us great favors, and though we are bound by stronger ties of love and necessity than most societies, is it prudent to suppose that automatically these great gifts and attributes shall be ours forever. If we are worthy, we shall probably continue to enjoy them. So the real question is, how shall we always be worthy of our present blessings?

Seen from this point of view, our A.A. Traditions are those attitudes and practices by which we may deserve, as a movement, a long life and a useful one. To this end, none could be more vital than our 10th Tradition, for it deals with the subject of controversy—serious controversy.

On the other side of the world, millions have not long since died in religious dissension. Other millions have died in political controversy. The end is not yet. Nearly everybody in the world has turned reformer. Each group, society and nation is saying to the other, "You must do as we say, or else". Political controversy and reform by compulsion has reached an all-time high. And eternal, seemingly, are the flames of religious dissension.

Being like other men and women, how can we expect to remain forever immune from these perils? Probably we shall not. At length, we must meet them all. We cannot flee from them, nor ought we try. If these challenges do come, we shall, I am sure, go out to meet them gladly and unafraid. That will be the acid test of our worth.

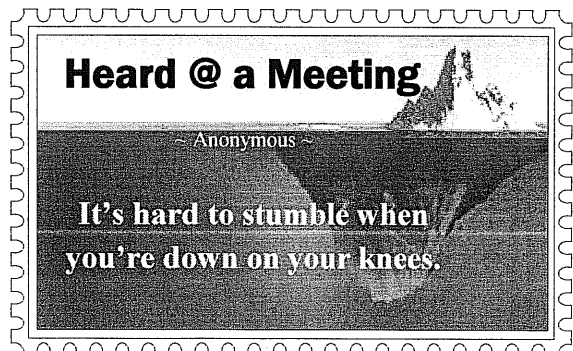
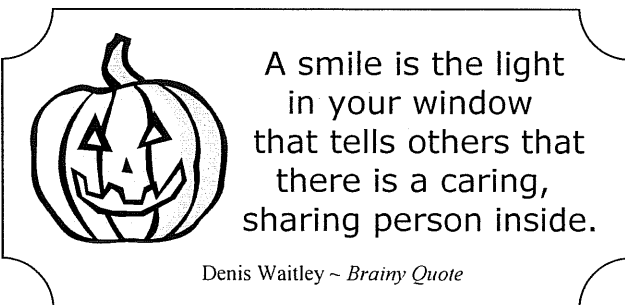
Our best defense? This surely lies in the formation of a Tradition respecting serious controversy so powerful that neither the weakness of persons nor the strain and strife of our troubled times can harm Alcoholics Anonymous. We know that A.A. must continue to live, or else many of us and many of our brother alcoholics throughout the world will surely resume the hopeless journey to oblivion. That must never be.

As though by some deep and compelling instinct we have thus far avoided serious controversies. Save minor and healthy growing pains, we are at peace among ourselves. And because we have thus far adhered to our sole aim, the whole world regards us favorably.

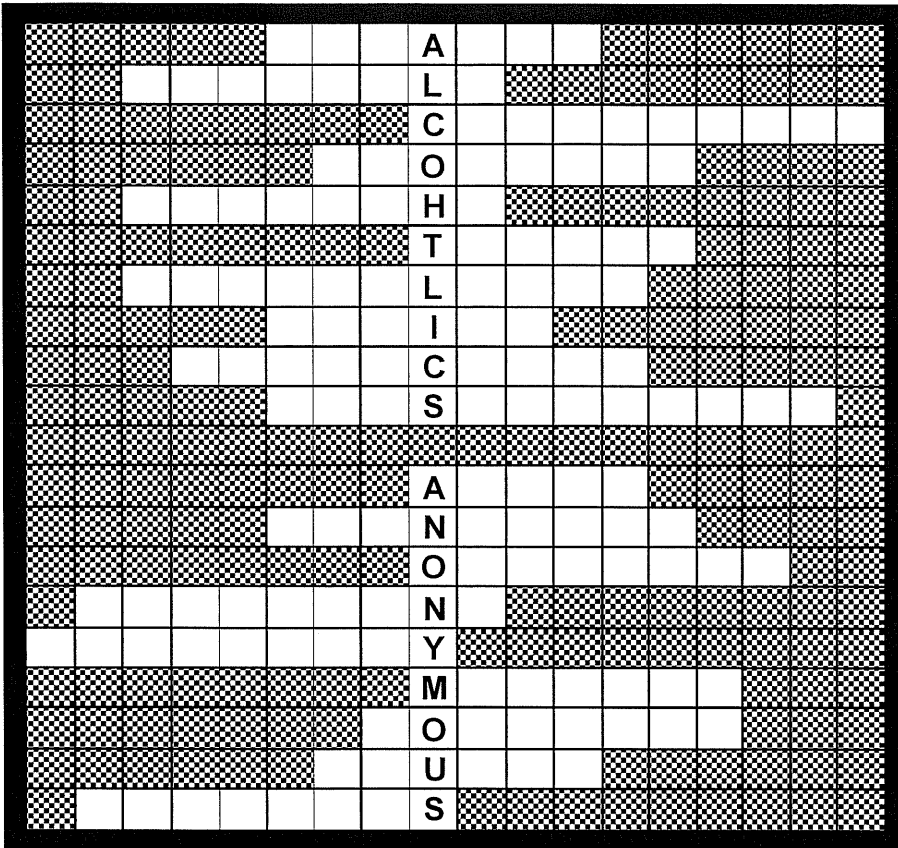
May God grant us the wisdom and fortitude ever to sustain an unbreakable unity.

Step Ten Puzzle - If you are baffled, you know where you can find the answers!

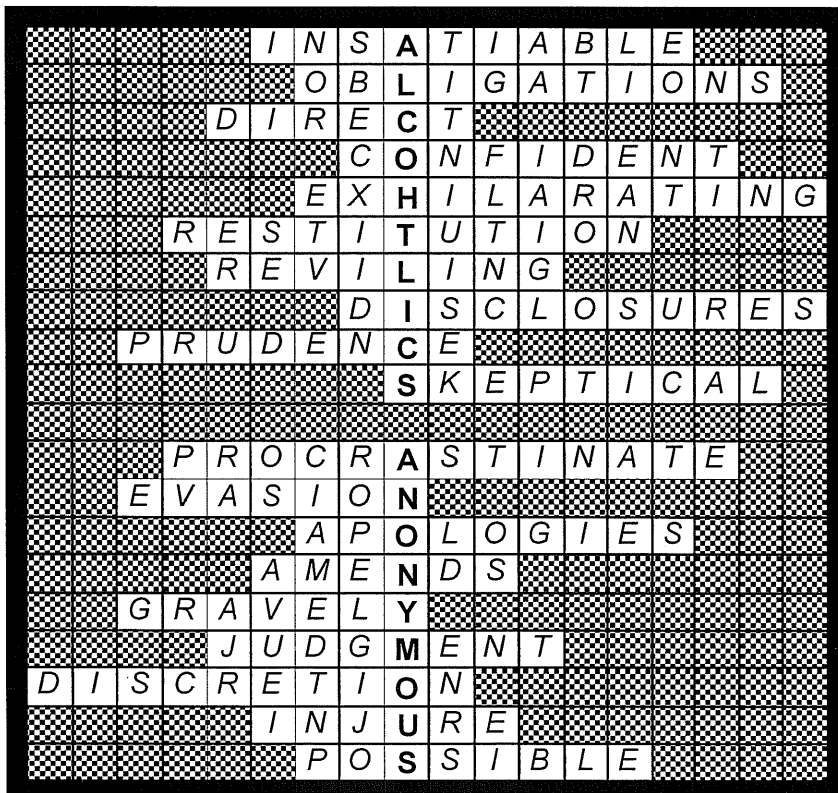

## BUFFALO CENTRAL COMMITTEE MINUTES

September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2012
