## AA Has Not Changed

I called the AA office and asked for help. Don O. came to my home on Sunday July 16, 1972. This was going to be the first day not drinking beer. That night Don took my wife and me to North Buffalo Group. Monday we went to Amherst-Snyder and Tuesday the Williamsville Group. This was my beginning in AA. All three groups were filled with people. I remember going into these meetings and found everyone milling around talking to each other. Don introduced me to a lot of people. Of course I couldn't remember any names. It was a warm and cheerful greeting.

Once we sat down everyone seemed to get more serious about the things we talked about. People all told about what they do in AA service. We had no treatment centers in those days, so all sober and intoxicated people came to our meetings. It didn't faze anyone to sit with drunks.

We received all the 12 Step calls coming to our office. Don O. made these calls every week. Within a few weeks he called me and told where I could meet him at one of these calls. It was a wonderful experience to watch and listen to Don share with someone who seemed desperate for help. Don led a large number of people to AA meetings.

After I was sober 1 year the Williamsville Group let me become the Chairman. I had already made coffee, clean-up the kitchen, set up and put away chairs and tables at our meeting. Our activity level was high. Pat and I went to a lot of Speaker Meeting. I really appreciated Pat's support.

After a few years of sobriety I joined the Treatment Facilities Committee. We were responsible for all the AA meetings held at different facilities. I eventually became the Chairman. This was a wonderful experience for me.

Don O. had me Going to meetings all over Western NY and Canada. It was always a good feeling to meet so many different people. One time we went to a meeting on Central Ave in Fort Erie. This was the street where I was born. I was surprised when they had sandwiches after the meeting.

After my time on the Treatment Facility Committee I started going to the Attica Prison. Sammy K., an inmate, started the Beacon Group. The inmates ran the meeting and we were visitors. They usually asked us to speak. I went once a month to Attica meetings for almost 10 years. During my time in AA I joined the Convention Committee and eventually Chaired one year. My Co-Chair was Early D. We enjoyed working together. During all this time Don O. and I continued to do a lot of 12 Step work. One time Kevin N. and I went to Batavia for a 12 Step call. We were faced with a drunk sitting on a toilet with a rifle in his hands. He handed it to me when I asked for it. We eventually took him to ECMC. He continues to be sober today. During my early years I took over the New Frontiers. In those days we called it "Frontierman". You can see the name was not appropriate for the blend of members we had at AA. I was the Editor for several years. I attended several Central Committee Meetings and still attend GSA meetings.

All these committee's continue to function. They always need new people to help. They need members who will chair these meetings and arrange speakers. All our meetings still need someone to make coffee, set-up chairs and tables and clean the kitchen. The service needed when I came in 41 years ago still remains just like I left them. Come on and join us, we're only one step away from where you sit.

### **Helping Others**

All I had to do was "Let Go-Let God". It's crazy but through taking care of others and being a mother, I am taking care of me. Being responsible and reliable! And yes, I'm still making those postcards (my little service). If you haven't seen them, they are little postcards on photo paper with AA sayings or inspirational quotes from the Big Book or other recovery material. I do it at my cost, on my time. I give them out to the AA members who still suffer, maybe to give them a little "Hope". They are Not the program...Just something I do to give back! The program of AA, God and fellowship is how we stay sober. With the help of my fellows, we have 2 years of sobriety.

### **Complete Abstinence**

25 years of sobriety and I'm now fascinated with near beer. This was my name even though it has other names. I was a beer drinker and wondered what it taste like. Did it taste like beer? I started to notice this beer on the shelves in stores. I spent to much time thinking about it. Something in me knew drinking pretend beer would lead me back to the real thing.

During a trip to Albany, I was at a large meeting sitting at a beginners table. This table had about 40 people sitting at it. When asked if anyone had a topic, I told them about of AA members drinking pretend beer. The entire group turned on me thinking I was going to drink it. In side I was thinking, I have 25 years sobriety, why are you talking to me. Before the night was over they convinced me I was in a bad place. They suggested I was closer to a drink than I thought I was. During the drive home I realized they were right. I needed to change my thinking and get out of my mind. I'm thankful I never drank pretend beer and ended back with the real stuff.

At other meetings, members suggested that drinking pretend beer, smoking pot, abusing prescription drugs or use of hard drugs was dangerous for AA members. They all will lead us back to our old lives. I don't want to take that chance. Complete abstinence has given me a new wonderful life.

## From the Archives:

~~~~~In October 1969, GSO in New York hosted a different kind of AA gathering. It brought sober alcoholics from fifteen countries, but it wasn't an international convention. It focused on service, but not on the New York GSO itself. It was the first World Service Meeting. Rick W. describes the meeting as "one of Bill's last pushes for communication and unity worldwide." Bill summed up its purpose in a piece for the *Grapevine*: "to ensure that help will always be available for the sick alcoholic wherever he is or whatever language he speaks." Its mission was also beautifully expressed in the words of the delegates themselves, at the start of the meeting, when each of them recited, in his or her own language, A.A.'s First Tradition: "Our common welfare should come first. Personal recovery depends on A.A. unity" (*Box 4-5-9*, Holiday Issue 1969). From Arturo E., of Colombia, you might have heard "Nuestro bienestar comun debe tener la preferencia; la recuperacion personal depende de la unidad de A.A." (*Box 4-5-9* Fall 1969 and aa.org). From Jacques A. or Roger P., France's delegates, it would have sounded like, "Notre bien-etre commun devrait venir en premier lieu; le retablissement personnel depend de l' unite des AA" (*Box 4-5-9* Fall 1969 and aa.org).

Looking at more details from that first meeting, we can see how the Traditions brought a kind of unity centered in the spirit, rather than the human ego. The delegates hadn't been brought to New York for marching orders, from Bill or anyone else. He saw New York as the "senior service center" among lots of world organizations, and was helping to make sure that GSO there didn't "run the whole world of A.A. (*Grapevine*, silk-worth.net)." The delegates came to share their countries' experience, strength and hope. They shared stories with a lot in common. From both Belgium and South Africa, they reported facing the challenges of working in more than one language, and finding success through grace—in South Africa, Bill waived his royalties from literature sales. In Colombia and Norway, A.A.'s had faced the problems that came with accepting money from outside groups, and moved on to self-support. The U.K. was reorganizing its service structure, and must have learned from New Zealand's example, of trying only to do things at that level that could be easily undone. All of them gave each other the benefits of experience, and found a new unity, grounded in the primary purpose that sent Bill to meet with Dr. Bob: to stay sober, and help other alcoholics achieve sobriety (*Box 4-5-9*, Holiday Issue 1969).

World Service Meetings have continued since then, with a continued faithfulness to that tradition of autonomy within countries. Instead of some power centralized in North American AA, there is the same sort of unity found among us in the fellowship, with countries sponsoring other countries. The idea is "primarily shared experience," rather than one country giving another one orders or money. Representatives of countries new to AA can learn things like the meaning of the traditions, how to arrange for literature to be translated, and how to deal with problems other than alcohol being brought up at meetings. These meetings are held every other year. In between are the zonal meetings, where representatives from one region of the world get together to pinpoint what to discuss at the next World Service Meeting (Rick W., conversation). The meetings are helping Bill's dream, expressed in the Big Book, come true: "Someday, we hope that every alcoholic who journeys will find a Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous at his destination" (*Alcoholics Anonymous* 162). Not every country has A.A. yet—some of the African countries still have none (Rick W.). But, just like alcoholism can appear anywhere in the world, the program can work anywhere, no matter what language it's delivered in. It will always be the language of the heart.

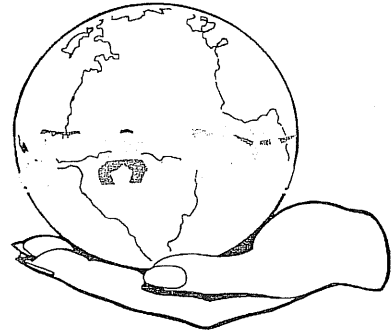

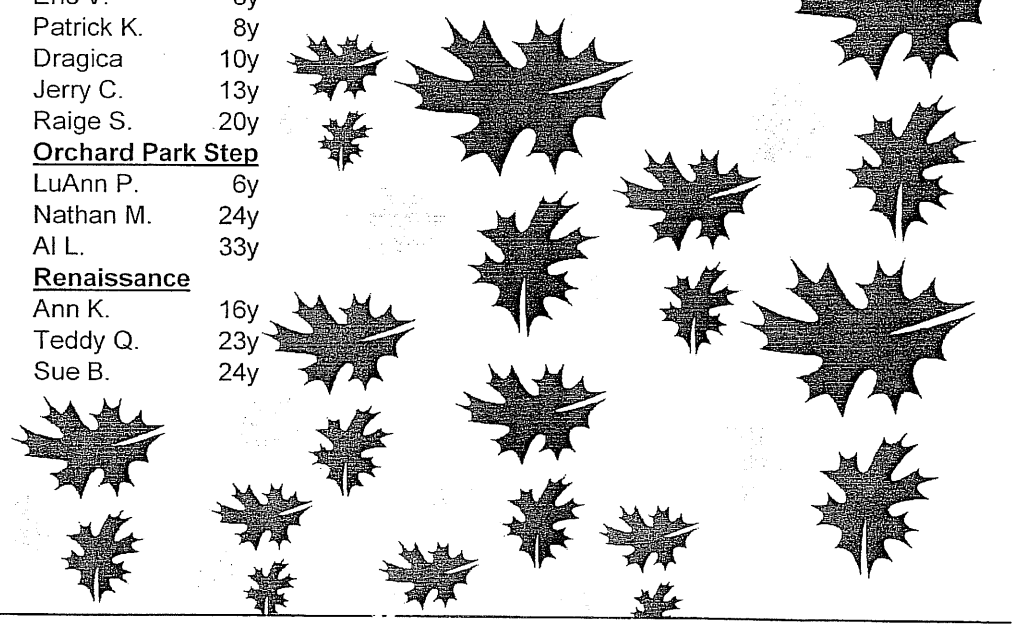

Expense

Our expenses for the month totaled \$7,135. There were no unusual expenses this month, and it was a three pay period month. Next month, we will see literature expenses increase. The computer repair expense, mentioned in last month's report, of \$260.00 was recognized this month.

Our current checking balance for Central Office is \$16,452.78 and our Prudent Reserve is \$23,116.50.

Accounts Receivable

The accounts receivable total is \$1,219.44, the majority being current, 3 invoices over 30 days and one group having a small credit. This is the highest total we have had this year. This prompts me to remind all groups that we do accept credit cards for purchases.
