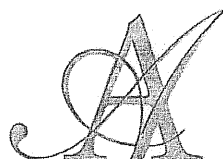
## THE SPIRITUAL PRINCIPLES OF THE 12 TRADITIONS

The Twelve Traditions are often referred to as, "Why it works." They ensure the continuance of A.A. as a whole, by providing guidelines for groups to evaluate their activities and actions. In a practical vein they are, individually and collectively, humility builders for the group; they ask that the group consider its conduct from a broader perspective and, when necessary, give up something for the overall good of A.A.

The Traditions also contain spiritual principles. These principles, when applied in our lives, complement the Steps as a guide to personal recovery. Here, taken from Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, (with minor editorial modification) are the spiritual principles of the Traditions that I strive to apply in my daily life:

1. The A.A. member conforms to the principles of recovery; at first because he must, later because he discovers a way of life he really wants to live. (Unity)
2. When we come to understand the wisdom of the group decision and the necessity of patiently awaiting developments, the real and permanent leadership of A.A. can offer the quiet opinion, the sure knowledge and humble example that resolve a crisis, leading by example, rather than driving by mandate. (Group Conscience)
3. When confronted by the fear that is the true basis of intolerance, we need only ask, "What would the Master do?" (Membership)
4. Eventually, we must conform to whatever tested principles guarantee survival. Sobriety must be our sole objective. In all other respects there is perfect freedom of will and action. We have the right to be wrong, but we no longer have the right to harm others. (Autonomy)
5. It is the great paradox of A.A. that we know we can seldom keep the precious gift of sobriety unless we give it away. (Primary Purpose)
6. We are all perfectionists who, failing perfection, have gone to the other extreme. We can not be all thing's to all men, nor should we try. (Non-Affiliation)
7. We, too, should be self-supporting through our own contributions. Not only is it a responsibility of sobriety, it is essential to our self-esteem. (Self-Supporting)
8. We give freely what has been given freely to us. (Non-Professional)
9. Unless each A.A. member follows to the best of his ability our suggested Twelve Steps to recovery, he almost certainly signs his death warrant. His drunkenness and dissolution are not penalties inflicted by people in authority; they result from his personal disobedience to spiritual principles. (Spirit of Service)
10. We should not back away from our individual responsibility to act as we believe upon the issues of our time, yet self-righteousness should not cause us to enforce our will on others. (Outside Issues)
11. Personal ambition has no place in A.A. There is never need to praise ourselves. (Attraction Rather Than Promotion)
12. The spiritual substance of anonymity is sacrifice. We try to give up our natural desires for personal distinction as A.A. members both among fellow alcoholics and before the general public. We are sure that humility, expressed by anonymity, is the greatest safeguard that Alcoholics Anonymous can ever have. (Principles Before Personalities) The spiritual principles of the traditions teach us that, "we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all."

### A.A. on "Holiday"

I recently had the good fortune to be able to travel to Ireland with my sober partner, Bill. We were on Pilgrimage and although the pilgrimage was organized by my work place only the Executive Director & Executive Treasurer went with us (I have never felt it necessary to share our alcoholism or recovery with either) – the other Pilgrims were from all over.

Before leaving I went to aa.org and printed out a list of AA offices in Ireland. We traveled from Galway (not on my list) to Dublin (where the General Service Office was located). There was also a 24 hour hotline phone number in Limerick so we felt prepared.

I had never been overseas and had no idea how the organized touring of a Pilgrimage leaves so little free time. Most days we would reach our hotel shortly before a late dinner, and had early departures the next morning.

We finally called the hotline when we arrived in Limerick and were scheduled to stay two nights. We spoke with Michele, a very nice and helpful hotline volunteer and got a number to call for a ride. We called and left a message for John. When we returned the next night there was a message at the desk for us from John. Unfortunately we got back too late that night to make the meeting with John, and we were off again in the morning.

By now we both are about five or six days without a meeting and getting grumpy.

We spent our last couple of nights in Dublin and finally had a free afternoon to wander around Dublin city for shopping and lunch. Bill and I decided to go to a pub that promised they had steak, (the beef in Ireland is a different story). While there, we noticed that a table behind us left a half of a pint of unfinished Guinness when they left. We chuckled how we would have never done that when we were drinkers, we even snapped a photo.

Rather than shop we caught the 3:30 pm bus back to the hotel thinking we would try the hotline again. Since it was a holiday weekend the General Service Office was closed, so we called the 24 hour hotline in Limerick. Michele answered once more and gave us a street near us that had a meeting at "half eight", "behind the Roman Catholic Church". "No", she didn't know the name but it was the only RC Church on the street. Ok, so not the best directions but our tour guide told us it was close but NOT that close. We called for a taxi.

The taxi came and the driver said he NEEDED an address! He didn't know where the street was and I'm sure I was mispronouncing the name! Our helpful volunteer was in Limerick and didn't know Dublin at all. What to do?? Our bus driver Tommy was checking fluids in the bus so I gave up the whole notion of anonymity and asked if he could help us. Of course he whipped out his cell phone and got the website up in a couple clicks and directed us to a meeting. Did I mention we went completely off the web for our vacation? We had left our cell phones and laptops home!

We arrived plenty early and the meeting was not the one we were looking for but we were right where we belonged! The members welcomed us with open arms and asked us to read. Bill read "How it Works" and after only a few words, a sense of "ease and comfort" overcame me and I felt completely at home, and at peace.

After the meeting we were asked to join some of the members for 'tea', we laughed so hard (as only alcoholics can) while talking about how AA had transformed us all! It was the perfect way to end our stay. The following day we flew home.



## From the Archives:

## An Early Central Office

If you found yourself in downtown Dallas in late September 1947, you might have seen an office building bigger than any you'd passed before—the biggest one in Texas at the time. It wasn't just a block of windows, either. It had what they called a revival style, with elegant ledges up enough stories you'd get dizzy imagining walking on them, and, higher than all of them, a turret like you might see on a castle. That was the Davis Building, where the Republic Bank had its headquarters ([thedavisbuilding.com](http://thedavisbuilding.com)).

It's possible, though, that you knew what had just opened its doors there: the central office of Alcoholics Anonymous in Dallas. There's a good chance Dick P. would have greeted you when you walked in, maybe with a limp or a stiff wrist. After he poured you a cup of coffee, and listened to you, he might have told you that he'd gotten paralyzed by drinking Jamaica ginger—not with self pity, but to show you that you were not alone. Even if your body wasn't injured like his, that would have helped you open up about your own hurt, the agonizing, inside kind your drinking brought you and the people you loved. He might have told you that there was a way out, and then stopped to answer the phone, to set up a 12 step call, and maybe even take you on one with him ("DIA History," [aadallas.org](http://aadallas.org)).

At some point, he might have suggested that you go to one of the meetings in Dallas, and mentioned Esther E., who helped bring A.A. to the city in 1943. The central office had opened with the end of World War II, when soldiers were returning home with alcoholism, and needing this new solution. If Dick seemed a little overwhelmed by everything he had to do, that would have been why. He, and everyone who helped get the office going, were helping many people start new, sober lives ("Dallas AA History," [aadallas.org](http://aadallas.org)).

Before the 12 Traditions were accepted by the fellowship, there were central offices, or intergroup', "to aid groups in their common purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers." For decades now, they have helped steer lost alcoholics to the solution, sponsored events that help us enjoy our sobriety, and done much more (like putting out this newsletter!). They survive by the support we give them through our groups, and by the work of people like Dick P., organizing things, answering phones, and, most important, being there to let suffering alcoholics know they're not alone (*A.A. Guidelines: Central or Intergroup Offices*, GSO, Box 459). ~~~~ Chad P.

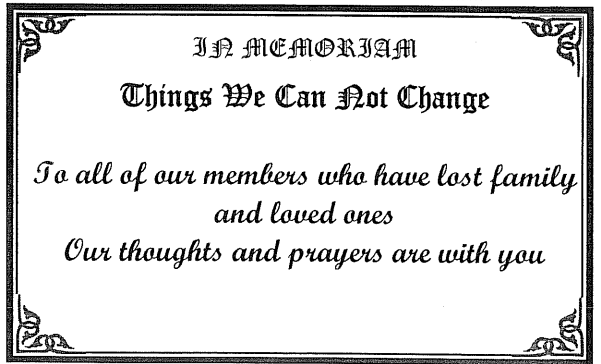
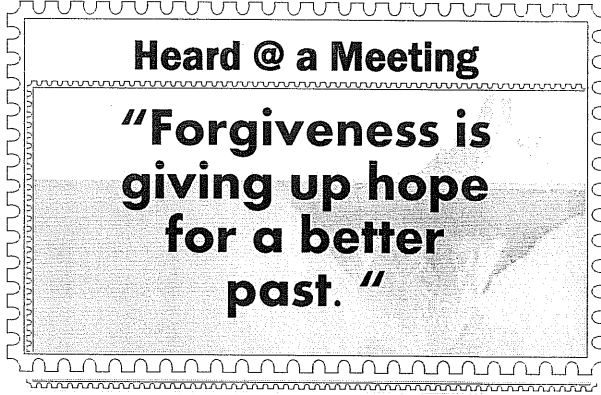

#### •ENVELOPE SYSTEM: Envelope System – August 2014

We received \$ 855.00 in donations this month. This amount was higher due to the quarterly and semi-annual gifts. There were no new donors or return donors that have not given to date.

As mentioned last month, we have received permission to place envelope system flyers in the registration packages for the Fall convention.

•STEERING COMMITTEE: There was a quorum. Zones 1, 2, 3 & 8 were in attendance. Zones 4, 5, & 7 are in need of steering co. reps. Zone 4 covers south east buffalo, Zone 5 covers Niagara county. Zone 7 covers east buffalo. We meet at 5:30 right here at central office, just before our central co. meeting. The steering committee oversees the whole of Alcoholics Anonymous in the area & considers whether the actions policies. The manner of conducting meetings could have an effect on local groups and AA as a whole, as guided by the 12 traditions. The steering co. also makes recommendations to central committee, follows through on various tasks, matters or issues as directed by central co. serves as confidential contact liaison with the executive sec. of central office. #### •FINANCIAL REPORT:

Total Income: \$8,659. Literature sales were average. Group contributions were below average \$3,676. Of note was a \$2,250 contribution made by a retreat, equally split between the 3 main accounts (CC, Corrections & Treatment). Thank you to the everyone who supports WNY AA!

Total Expenses: \$7,787, above average, primarily due to a \$1,920 literature for resale purchase.

Monthly Net: Income of \$872, which brings us to a positive \$387 since January. The current Checking Account balance is \$23,605.47. Petty Cash is at \$3,000. Our Prudent Reserve had the usual interest bump, balance is \$23,127.07. Books and literature inventory total \$13,888.85, in our normal range.

Corrections Facilities: Current Balance is \$2,659.87. Contributions were \$820 and expenses were \$3.

Treatment Committee: Current Balance is \$1,497.05, Contributions were \$915 & expenses were \$483.

Group Accounts Receivable: \$681.70, up from last month. There are 5 groups in the current to 30 day range with a total of \$537. There are 3 groups in the 30 and over range with a total of \$145.

#### •TREATMENT: August 2014 Treatment Report

The treatment facility committee met on July 21<sup>st</sup>. There were 8 people in attendance. We discussed the new treatment speaker meeting at 291 Elm (Thursday's at 6pm) and getting the Tuesday ECMC meeting (detox and rehab) started. We also spoke about beginning a Spanish speaking treatment meeting in the West Side. We meet the third Monday of the month at Central Committee at 6pm, with our next three treatment meetings on 8/18, 9/15, and 10/20.

We would also like to thank all groups that contribute to treatment meetings with their time and 7<sup>th</sup> tradition contributions, which go to providing literature to newcomers in treatment facilities. Carrying the message to potential alcoholics in treatment facilities is extremely rewarding and is often the highlight of my week. Please consider joining, we could use your help!
