Why We Were Chosen

Personal criticism you must expect; lack of appreciation will be common; ridicule will be your lot; your motives will be misjudged. You must be prepared for adversity, for what men call adversity is the ladder you must use to ascend the rungs toward spiritual perfection, and remember, in the exercise of this power I shall not exact from you beyond your capabilities."

"You are not selected because of exceptional talents, and be careful always, if success attends your efforts not to ascribe to personal superiority that to which you can lay claim only by virtue of my gift. If I had wanted learned men to accomplish this mission, this power would have been entrusted to the physician and scientist.

If I had wanted eloquent men, there would have been many anxious for the assignment, for talk is the easiest used of all talents with which I have endowed mankind. If I had wanted scholarly men, the world is filled with better qualified men than you who would be available.

You were selected because you have been the outcasts of the world and your long experience as drunkards has made or should make you humbly alert to the cries of distress that come from the lonely hearts of alcoholics everywhere."

Tradition One...an editorial by Bill W.

“Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity.”

“Each member of Alcoholics Anonymous is but a small part of a great whole. A.A. must continue to live or most of us will surely die. Hence our common welfare comes first. But individual welfare follows close afterward.”

Our whole A.A. program is securely founded on the principle of humility—that is to say, perspective. Which implies, among other things, that we relate ourselves rightly to God and to our fellows; that we each see ourselves as we really are—“a small part of a great whole.” Seeing our fellows thus, we shall enjoy group harmony. That is why A.A. Tradition can confidently state, “Our common welfare comes first.”

“Does this mean,” some will ask, “that in A.A. the individual doesn’t count too much? Is he to be swallowed up, dominated by the group?”

No, it doesn’t seem to work out that way. Perhaps there is no society on earth more solicitous of personal welfare, more careful to grant the individual the greatest possible liberty of belief and action. Alcoholics Anonymous has no “musts.” Few A.A. groups impose penalties on anyone for non-conformity. We do suggest, but we don’t discipline. Instead, compliance or non-compliance with any principle of A.A. is a matter for the conscience of the individual; he is the judge of his own conduct. Those words of old time, “Judge not”, we observe most literally.

“But”, some will argue, “if A.A. has no authority to govern its individual members or groups, how shall it ever be sure that the common welfare comes first? How is it possible to be governed without a government? If everyone can do as he pleases, how can you have naught but anarchy”?

The Answer seems to be that we A.A.s cannot really do as we please, though there is no constituted human authority to restrain us. Actually, our common welfare is protected by powerful safeguards. The moment any action seriously threatens the common welfare, group opinion mobilizes to remind us; our conscience begins to complain. If one persists, he may become so disturbed as to get drunk; alcohol gives him a beating. Group opinion shows him that he is off the beam, his own conscience tells him that he is dead wrong, and, if he goes too far, Barleycorn brings him real conviction. So it is we learn that in matters deeply affecting the group as a whole, “our common welfare comes first.” Rebellion ceases and cooperation begins because it must; we have disciplined ourselves. Eventually, of course, we operate because we really wish to; we see that without substantial unity there can be no A.A., and without that, without A.A., there can be little lasting recovery for anyone. We gladly set aside personal ambitions whenever these might harm A.A. we humbly confess that we are but “a small part of a great whole.”

Featured Committee of the Month **About Corrections**

The committee members provide meetings to local prisons. They serve the following prison facilities: Erie Holding Center, Alden, NY State & Erie County. The meetings at the holding facility (Erie) are both Men/Thursdays and Women/ Fridays. The same is true for Alden: Men/ Wednesday & Women/ Saturday. All prisons require clearance papers to be filled out and filed for admittance. Both NY State & Erie County clearance papers can be found on line to be downloaded and filled out. Know your prisoners. Prisoners in Erie County Jail are short term/ serious crimes. NY State prisoners are long term/ serious crimes. The committee coordinates between Area 50 GSA and the Buffalo Intergroup. Corrections Committee/ Buffalo Intergroup Corrections Committee./ Buffalo Intergroup has its own funds and bank account. Checks are sent to Central Office made out to Corrections. They need more male volunteers in general to cover the responsibilities. They are working on the ability to hand out Big Books to the inmates to use in prison and beyond. The clearance process for NY State prisons is quite detailed/ involved with pages of questions; "do NOT be discourages" says David N.: "It is a rewarding experience!".



In state prisons, the inmates run their meetings; the committee members are only guests. Yet, committee members must be present for the state meetings to happen. Most others prison meetings are taken in by the committee members as to readings and format. In these other meetings, the committee members run the meeting; and, the inmates attend.

Sounds rewarding! Give it a try!!!

This month's featured committee is *Corrections*. Please take a moment to listen to some information that the committee would like for you to know about what their purpose is, what you can do to get involved, how it helps the alcoholic who still suffers and how you can grow spiritually by being involved.

Purpose of Committee:

To carry the message of Alcoholics Anonymous to the still suffering alcoholics who are incarcerated in correctional institutions.

To coordinate A.A. groups and/or members in taking A.A. meetings into correctional facilities, to encourage participation in leading correctional facility meetings, and to provide a liaison between correctional facilities & A.A. groups.

How it helps the alcoholic who still suffers:

Corrections work is an opportunity to carry the A.A. message to alcoholics inside the walls of correctional facilities who want to live sober, one day at a time. Service work with the corrections committee reaches alcoholics who might never otherwise find the A.A. program and who have severely limited access to meetings.

Corrections helps alcoholics inside the walls to have faith and to know that they are not alone.

The alcoholic inside the walls is introduced to Bridging the Gap, which gives them a resource to get connected with alcoholics before & after release from a facility.

How you can grow spiritually by getting involved:

Corrections work embodies the spirit of the Responsibility Declaration: "*When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. And for that: I am responsible*"

Corrections work gets you out of yourself, helping to open the channel between you and a Higher Power.

Fosters the willingness, humility, and service through commitment to the 12th step and 3rd tradition.

How you can get involved:

The Corrections Committee meets at 5:30 pm on the 1st Sunday of every month at Central Office. Basement Room.

People on the committee can get involved by taking in meetings, helping to plan committee events & raise awareness of the committee's activities and needs, brainstorming ideas for increasing participation and improving communication between A.A. and the correctional facilities, by serving as a pen-pal to an alcoholic inmate, and more!

Facilities we service:

Erie county holding center, Alden county holding center, Gowanda prison, Wendy prison, and Collins prison. We also help out with Attica prison and Niagara county facilities sometimes.



- Do I go to enough AA meetings or read enough AA literature to really keep in touch?
- Do I share with AA all of me, the bad and the good, accepting as well as giving the help of the fellowship?
