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A Profound Sense of Gratitude How Fortunate We Are Today By Rick R.

Alcoholics Anonymous came into existence in 1935 when Bill and Bob started carrying their message to fortunate souls who, up to that point, had little hope of ever overcoming the disease of alcoholism. Prior to that, there were attempts to overcome the disease that came close but failed when they let other issues distract them from their primary purpose. I'm sure they had some, but not all, of the answers, but it did give our co-founders some of the answers as to "what not to do" when they established the steps and traditions. The book, Alcoholics Anonymous was published in 1939 after the first 100 alcoholics had maintained their sobriety. I was born in 1941, just two year after the Big Book was published. I was 28 years old when I came to the program which, at that time, was only in existence for 34 years. They say that Alcohol has been around for about 10 thousand years. How fortunate we are today, to be among the first, to have been chosen at this time to have a solution laid at our feet and for them to have the wisdom to not allow the first 164 pages of the Big Book to be edited or changed. When I talk of the word Gratitude, I ponder the vast amount of time (10 thousand years) that there was no answer to this problem and the hopelessness of those unfortunate souls before 1935. As a child I watched my parents and grand-parents, and many of the elders in my life hopelessly suffer through the pains of this disease and they didn't even consider it a disease. On October 15, I will celebrate 50 years of sobriety and no one could be more grateful for all the benefits I have

received as the results of clinging to this wonderful program and all the principles and values that have given me the tools that separated me from the delusional thinking of the past and showed me a path of recovery that has influenced so many people, starting with my immediate family and spiraling outwards to my relatives, my friends and coworkers and all my A.A. associates. If A.A. had come into existence and the Big Book would have been published just 30 years later than it was, I, most likely, would have been included in those unfortunate souls of the past that had no hope. I showed up at the doors of A.A. on Oct. 15, 1969 and as I see it, the Program had evolved just enough to be ready for this Grateful recipient and I will always be amazed by the timing of it all. In the 84 years of its existence, Alcoholics Anonymous has been the answer for millions and considering all the ten thousand years before the existence of A.A.; I believe we are very fortunate to be on the cutting edge of one of most important and beneficial developments in the history of mankind and to think that it all started when two common variety drunks got together and triggered the program of Alcoholics Anonymous. Words cannot express the Gratitude I have for this program considering all the suffering that went on prior to 1935 when God saw fit to intervene and offer up a choice, and fortunately, Bill and Bob were listening and heard His loving voice. As I read the long form of the Twelve Traditions and all the pains it took when tackling all the points and counter points while formulating our program, I am amazed that all the pieces fell in place as they are today, and they seem to have gotten it right. I am extremely Grateful for those that came before me and handed me the wonderful life I live today.



WHEN IS BREAKING YOUR ANONYMITY NOT AN ANONYMITY BREAK?

While much has been written in A.A. literature about anonymity, including in a General Service Conference approved pamphlet called “Understanding Anonymity,” communications coming into the General Service Office from members of the Fellowship suggest that there remains a great deal of misunderstanding about this “spiritual foundation of all our Traditions.” What follows are just a few examples of the types of inquiries that arrive through phone calls, e-mails and letters, and some of the responses from A.A. literature.

Q. “We have a member who moved here from somewhere else and he is using his last name in meetings. What should we say to this person who is breaking the Tradition of anonymity?”

A. A.A. co-founder Bill W. wrote in *The Language of the Heart* (p. 15) that “It should be the privilege of each individual A.A. to cloak himself with as much personal anonymity as he desires. His fellow A.A.s should respect his wishes and help guard whatever status he wants to assume.” It is thus up to each individual to decide how anonymous he or she wishes to be, at any level below that of the public level. Giving your last name in an A.A. meeting is not “breaking” A.A.’s Tradition of anonymity. In fact, the author of an article in the February 1969 *Grapevine* magazine attributed the following to A.A.’s other co-founder, Dr. Bob, regarding personal anonymity and the Eleventh Tradition: “Since our Tradition on anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English language that to maintain anonymity at any other level is definitely a violation of this Tradition. “The A.A. who hides his identity from his fellow A.A. by using only a given name violates the Tradition just as much as the A.A. who permits his name to appear in the press in connection with matters pertaining to A.A. “The former is maintaining his anonymity above the level of press, radio, and films, and the latter is maintaining his anonymity below the level of press, radio and films — whereas the Tradition states that we should maintain our anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.” (Dr. Bob and the Good Old-timers, pp. 264-65)

Q. “What if I see public figures at a meeting, such as an actor or actress, or the local chief of police?”

A. “Like everyone else, public figures should have the protection of anonymity to the extent that they desire it.” (“Understanding Anonymity,” p. 9)

Q. “I saw an ad in the paper for an A.A. group. It told where the group was meeting and everything. Shouldn’t you contact that group about breaking their anonymity at the public level?”

A. “Suppose a sick alcoholic never has the good fortune to meet an A.A. How is such a person going to find us? The search will be difficult if the local group thinks it should be anonymous, too. The (Eleventh) Tradition is talking about ‘personal anonymity,’ remember? Alcoholics will not be attracted to A.A. if they don’t know that it exists....” (“The Twelve Traditions Illustrated”)

Q. “I’m not ashamed of my alcoholism and don’t feel any need to keep my A.A. membership a secret. In fact, I think that my story will be able to help lots of others. I think that I should be able to use my full name in my book (or television interview, blog, Web site, etc.) when I share my A.A. experience. Why should anyone else have a problem with that?”


A. Disclosing your A.A. membership at the public level, in any publicly accessible medium, is considered a break of the A.A. Tradition of Anonymity. Bill W. wrote, in an article in *The Best of the Grapevine*, Volume 1, p. 278, “The old files at A.A. Headquarters reveal many scores of... experiences with broken anonymity. Most of them point up the same lessons. They tell us that we alcoholics —are the biggest rationalizes in the world; that fortified with the excuse we are doing great things for A.A. we can, through broken anonymity, resume our old and disastrous pursuit of personal power and prestige, public honors, and money — the same implacable urges that when frustrated once caused us to drink....”

Q. “Why do we say that ‘anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all of our Traditions?’”

A. “. . . anonymity is real humility at work. It is an all pervading spiritual quality which today keynotes A.A. life everywhere. Moved by the spirit of anonymity, we try to give up our natural desires for personal distinction as A.A. members both among fellow alcoholics and before the general public. As we lay aside these very human aspirations, we believe that each of us takes part in the weaving of a protective mantle which covers our whole Society and under which we may grow and work in unity.” (Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p. 187)



A.A. Public Information (PI) has one ultimate goal. We share the same goal as every A.A. group and every type of service work in A.A.: To carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. We try to reach potential alcoholics directly, as well as indirectly in three ways:

1. Informing the general public about the A.A. program.
2. Informing "the third person" who may come in contact with the active alcoholic.
3. By keeping the fellowship of A.A. informed, to members and groups may carry the message more effectively.

Why We Do It

We recognize some of the public has not had the opportunity to find out how the A.A. program works; because of this we understand there might be some confusion regarding A.A. amongst the public.

How We Do It

The methods we use to reach the public are many and vary. They include:


Services That We Offer:

- Upon request, help to stock public libraries with A.A. literature
- Place literature racks in high schools, colleges, police stations, libraries, and hospitals, while making sure the rack continues to be stocked with appropriate A.A. literature and meeting schedules
- Send a letter to high schools, offering A.A. literature and/or a presentation on A.A. –sharing about what A.A. does and what A.A. does not do.
- List open A.A. meetings in newspapers in the local area
- Place a small announcement in newspapers around the holidays
- Work with newspapers, informing them about our tradition of anonymity
- Respond to speaking requests at non-A.A. meetings





Internet presence:

There will be a Zoom based meeting for all interested when we have a few more people, date TBD Working on a chat function to provide contact with AA members in need of help. This is not to replace Nightwatch or the 12th step list, but to work in conjunction with it. Any group that would like a demo please email me at the Web Servant email address. We also need volunteers to do a proof of concept, hopefully about a dozen to start. Will have a kickoff/training meeting when we have some more people to start with. The aa.org website moved several of the pamphlet links around and we are trying to find the new links to add them. Be aware that it is sorted by region so for example all the online meetings are together under Online Meetings. We have been asked about digital baskets for meetings (these are for meetings themselves, not for the Central Office). Current convention: The convention will be cancelled for this Fall

Liaison GSA: GSA NYC has authorized a draw down of \$1.5 million from current reserves in order to sustain operations as a result of the significant reduction in contributions and literature sales due to the worldwide pandemic. There has been a decrease in income from last year of 2 million dollars. Groups have really helped GSA NYC over the past few months, although there is still a lot of work to do. Literature sales rose in September also. They have begun working on the 2021 operating budget. (Report courtesy of Dean C.)

Archives: If possible, we continue to have our work nights the 2nd and 4th Monday of every month. Our monthly committee meeting is held the 3rd Monday of each month live and in person, we also offer our archives committee meeting via Zoom. Tradition Eleven: Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.

- Do I sometimes promote AA so fanatically that I make it seem unattractive?
- Am I always careful to keep the confidences reposed in me as an AA member?
- Am I careful about throwing AA names around – even within the Fellowship?
- Am I ashamed of being a recovered, or recovering, alcoholic?
- What would AA be like if we were not guided by the ideas in Tradition Eleven? Where would I be?
- Is my sobriety attractive enough that a sick drunk would want such a quality for himself?

Concept XL: The trustees should always have the best possible committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Composition, qualifications, induction procedures, and rights and duties will always be matters of serious concern.

- Do we understand how the roles of nontrustee directors and nontrustee appointed committee members help serve and strengthen the committee system?
- How do we encourage our special paid workers to exercise their traditional “Right of Participation”?
- Do we practice rotation in all our service positions?

Bill W. wrote of Intergroup Offices, “Though not costly, these agencies are absolutely essential to our continued expansion—to our survival as a Fellowship. Their costs are a collective obligation that rests squarely upon all of us. Our support of services actually amounts to a recognition on our part that AA must everywhere function in full strength—and that, under our Tradition of self-support, we are all going to foot the bill”
