Treatment centers and detox’s are not open to outsiders. The jails aren’t letting in outsiders… Are there other way’s to be of service? The Delusion Had to be Smashed Like Men Who Had Lost Their Legs

As a kid approaching adolescence, I had my first encounter with alcohol, and it did something for me that I had never experienced before. It brought about a degree of peace and serenity in those first few minutes that I could not dismiss as just another good time. It started me on that road to fantasy land and thank God it only lasted fourteen years. I was quick to burn through those years starting off as lamp-shade drunkenness, and then the tolerance started to develop to the point that I was pretty good at drinking and that only lasted for a short time, then I enter into the black-out phase and that wasn't a pretty sight. My first wife left me and for the next two years I went through the self pity phase when I hung out in bars and got into fights, got locked up, and cried in my beer a lot. I spent much of those last few years thinking that one day I would evolve into a responsible adult and put all if it behind me, but that never happened. Then one day I woke up from a black-out drunk and somehow realized that if I didn't do something about my drinking, I was going to die a young and horrible death, I threw in the towel, called AA, and started this wonderful journey.

As I look back on it now, I can understand why alcohol had the effect on me that it didn't have on, nine out of ten, of the others that I drank with in those early days. We were all partying and the alcohol masked the differences between them and me. They enjoyed it all right but they went home and went to work the next morning. I went right back to the bar again and in search of that euphoria I experienced that first time I drank and every time there after.

After years of sobriety, it occurred to me that the drink quelled all of those fears and inhibitions that we alcoholics face each morning upon awakening that the normal drinker never has to face. That is what makes us different. Once our tolerance for alcohol is depleted, it never returns. That is the hardest fact for the alcoholic to face. In Ch. 3 of the Big Book it states: (The delusion that we are like other people, or presently may be, has to be smashed. We know that no real alcoholic ever recovers control.) In my early days of sobriety at the meetings in Los Angeles, most of the meetings that I attended read a portion of chapter 3 as well as the portion of chapter five that we do here. That portion of the book drives home the true nature of this disease but they stopped reading at the words: ad infinitum. I suggest that a person read one more paragraph after that. That always brought home the fact that I was responsible for my own recovery if I had a desire to stop drinking AA could help me accomplish that but by no means will it work for me until I except that devastating fact.


Examples of Group Contributions to A.A. Service Entities

Central Committee Minutes December 6st, 2020



The meeting started at 7:00 PM. We opened with a moment of silence followed by the serenity prayer. The readings read included the AA preamble, The Purpose of Central Committee and the 12 traditions. 14 groups were represented: Acceptance/welcome, Iron-horse, Buffalo group, Step action, Williams-ville, Action group, Questions and Answers, Thruway group, Victory Women, Tuesday Men's Discussion Group, Orchard Park Step, Lakeshore, Main and High, North Evans Men

Internet presence: The committee is in need of more hands to help with editing, updating meetings and general design help. You don't necessarily need to be a geek to help. You do not necessarily need to be part of the committee to be an editor. There will be a Zoom based meeting for all interested when we have a few more people. Working on a chat function to provide contact with AA members in need of help. This is not to replace Nightwatch or the 12th step list, but to work in conjunction with it. Any group that would like a demo please email me at the Web Servant email address. We also need volunteers to do a proof of concept, hopefully about a dozen to start. Emails will be going out to those that signed up for the two volunteer openings soon to schedule dates. If your homegroup would like a presentation on the chat feature, or just has questions let us know. There are now separate forms for updating meeting contacts and meeting details. Please update your contact information for your group. Let's also keep meeting details updated, especially closures and when switching to online (Zoom, etc) Online meetings can now be entered without a physical address and all are currently set to Buffalo, NY. If you would like the City changed (for example: Derby, Williamsville, etc.) please use the Update Meeting form on the website. Printable PDF versions of the schedule are available at <https://Buffaloaany.org/pdf-schedules/>. Be aware that it is sorted by region so for example all the online meetings are together under Online Meetings. There are also now 2 PDF's that are more complete and have our contact number etc on it. These 2 are done manually and should be updated every 1-2 weeks. One is Portrait format and one is Landscape format. Working on the format of a mailing list that can be signed up for and can be used by the Central Office and the website for important messages. We have been asked about digital baskets for meetings (these are for meetings themselves, not for the Central Office). The schedule has the ability to add that ability to meetings, but each meeting is responsible for setting up their own accounts. The services that can be used are Venmo, Square Case, or PayPal. Digital baskets can be used by online or physical meetings. Anyone interested in more information or have questions please email the Web Servant.

Current convention: We have a deposit down at the Millennium Hotel, and plan on having the convention Oct. 23rd-25th 2021 if possible and safe.

Liaison GSA: Unfortunately, the next GSA Area 50 function is not until 12/12/20 at 10 AM on Zoom. Log in information is available through Area 50 GSA Website. All are welcome to the Area Roundtable Event! I attended, via Zoom, on 12/5 the US-CAN GSA Forum Eastern Region. Several hundred GSA servants listened to select Delegates and GSA Representatives discuss numerous relevant topics. Of special note was the appeal by Delegates to AA Members to be forward in seeking to help the newcomer on Zoom meetings. The feeling was that a myriad of newcomers are flocking to Zoom however they are not connecting with the fellowship beyond the actual meeting and not receiving the benefit of two of our three legacies-Recovery and Service which is spawned through good sponsorship. They asked each of us to go beyond the extended hand and actively and sincerely try to reach the newcomers beyond the Zoom meeting. It was also emphasized by Delegates that the Central Offices are struggling to keep their meeting schedules both in person and Zoom current and accurate.

- Do I share with AA all of me, the bad and the good, accepting as well as giving the help of the fellowship?
