## History Offers Good Lesson For A.A., July 1945

How many of the readers of The Grapevine have heard about the Washington Temperance Society? It was quite an organization in its time – in the 1840's. Its organizers called themselves "reformed drunkards" and they set about "reforming" other drunkards. Does the idea seem familiar?

### **CLAIMED 100,000 IN 3 YEARS**

They did all right, too, they got going in the spring of 1840, in Baltimore. In early 1843, they were claiming that they had persuaded 100,000 habitual drunkards to sign the pledge.

Older temperance organizations had to stand aside – or climb onto the bandwagon. The new society was getting the headlines. It organized a mass meeting in City Hall Park in New York City in 1841 that attracted more than 4,000 listeners – the speakers stood on upturned rum kegs – and it had 1,800 new members when it closed its campaign in that city.

There were triumphal parades in Boston – where historic Faneuil Hall was jammed to the doors to hear the speaker – and in other eastern cities, Speakers toured the West and South. The Press of the day gave the society uncounted columns of publicity. The society petered out. The "why" contains a lesson – and a moral – for A.A.

There was no ONE reason, of course. A reason was that older temperance organizations hired some of the society's better speakers. That reason couldn't have wrecked the society if it had had its feet solidly on the ground.

Another reason was that politicians looked hungrily at its swelling membership. Some of them climbed aboard the wagon (there is inference that in those times, at least, some politicians could qualify for membership) and they helped to wreck local groups through their efforts to line up votes.

The Abolition movement was gaining strength and there was division within groups as men took their stand on the issue of slavery. The Washingtonians were confident. They rebuffed overtures of older temperance organizations, they scorned old methods. Local groups went their separate ways, made their own mistakes, and learned their own lessons. Some, with larger membership, dipped into their treasuries to finance their own publications. There was no overall direction of educational policy. Editors of local society publications got into squabbles with editors of other temperance papers.

**FACTORS WITHIN**

There was division, in those times, among the older organizations. Some of them plumped for total abstinence as a rule of conduct; others hedged and wanted to direct their efforts against use of spirituous liquors, accepting use of wines and beers as normal conduct. Some of the more hardy souls already were clamoring for legislation that would outlaw the traffic in beverage alcohol. All of these factions pulled and hauled on the society's members.

Older temperance organizations were finding it increasingly difficult to interest the public in their aims. The Washingtonians with their unique methods – their missionary work among drunkards, their open-air parades and mass meetings, their "experience" programs that afforded a thrill-seeking public the opportunity of enjoying vicariously the degenerate experiences of sodden sinners – were stealing the show. The older organizations borrowed Washingtonian speakers and methods to draw larger audiences to their meetings.

Because the Washingtonian movement, in its beginnings, was concerned only with the reclaiming of drunkards and held that it was none of its affair if others used alcohol who seemed to be little harmed by it, the makers and sellers of alcoholic beverages looked upon the new movement with a tolerant, even approving eye. The habitual drunk was no more welcome in the nineteenth century grogshop than he is in the present day cocktail lounge.

**ONE FATAL OMISSION**

But in its zeal to increase its membership as rapidly as possible, the society pledged many persons to total abstinence who were intemperate drinkers, probably, but who were not alcoholic in the present-day definition of the term.

The Washingtonian movement might have survived, however, might have triumphed over its mistakes, and its enemies (and well wishers), except for one fatal omission.

Its organizers believed they could get along without a Higher Power.

It wasn't a particularly religious time. And inebriates, then as now, had generally lost touch with Him. Many of them, in fact, were outspoken in their denunciations of all of His works, especially as demonstrated in the activities and attitudes of so-called Christian folk. The meetings of the society's groups were conducted usually without reference to Him.

Washingtonians were not atheists; it just hadn't occurred to them that God as we understand Him could help them to stay sober. In fact, some of them believed that if they invited God into their councils, sectarianism also would push its way in, and their movement would be taken over by one or another of the churches.

The society wasn't on God's side and, consequently it disintegrated.

**SOURCE OF STRENGTH**

An editor of that day wrote:

"That the exclusion of all religious forms and the entire abstraction of religion from temperance were necessary for the reclamation of the drunkard, we have never believed.... The drunkard may have felt hostile to religion while in the bar-room and amid the fumes of liquor, and he may feel so after he has reformed and been taught to believe that he is better than a Christian, but never did a poor drunkard go up in sincerity to sign the pledge, without feeling himself a prodigal, commencing a work of return to his Heavenly Father, and needing that Father's help: and who would not have gratefully knelt and listened to a prayer for that help on his new endeavors. And we believe that if the hundreds of thousands of signatures in our country had been accompanied with prayer and some religious enforcement, their power and efficiency would have been incomparably stronger."(5)

Is it necessarily true that there's nothing new under the sun," or that "history repeats itself?" A.A. is new, a new partnership with God in a useful endeavor. History NEED NOT repeat, in the case of A.A., the sorry story of the Washingtonians, rise and fall.

There are, however, lessons to be learned from history.






**The Road to Mental Freedom  
 Understanding Steps Six and Seven  
 By Rick R.**

Since the day I entered the Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.) program, I have had an insatiable appetite for learning all I could about the disease of alcoholism and having completed a very thorough fourth and fifth steps, and examining my motives for everything I did, in steps sixth and seven, it occurred to me that most of my problems in life involved my interfacing with, "Those Other People." As I got further into the steps and started to process each and every one of these inter actions, it became apparent to me that the basic cause of my discontent was, *low self esteem* and that, until I resolved that, there would be very little *peace of mind*. I had to get right with everyone. They say that *understanding is the key to right living*, and I read just about anything I can get my hands on, about these issues, that reinforce the principles we learn in the A.A. program such as; Emmet Fox's Sermon on The Mount, and others including, Scott Peck's, The Road Less Traveled, Ernest Kurtz and Kathleen's Ketchum's The Spirituality of Imperfection, Max Ehrmann's poem, Desiderata, and the like. This kind of reference material helps me to get a better perspective on how to reduce the obstacles that stand in the way of my ability to solve these problems. I have to be willing to get right with "every human being I know" as suggested in step eight. (12&12) Scott Peck describes the word *Love* as: *Caring for and nurturing another person's soul*. I now look at Love as a verb and not a noun. You can love someone that doesn't love you back when you use this definition and as the result, I truly wish the best for every human being I know and offer help and guidance when I can. I become their best advocate. If I want to heal, I must look deeper and try to *understand that other person* and be strong enough to, first, *reign in my ego*, then to realize that the other person may be reacting to *my adversarial position*. Finding ways of removing my own judgmental attitudes opens the door to love and compassion. Today, I can love everyone by simply giving them the respect and acceptance that I would want for myself. After doing my best to adopt this plan of action over the years, I can only say that nothing that I have ever done, with respect to *Those Other People*, has been more rewarding than this approach. I have, to the best of my understanding, stopped judging others by their outside behavior and *have the strength to look deeper*. When I do that, I usually find a person, not too different from myself, trying to protect himself from his fears, and I just can't bring myself to pile on and compound his pain. My heart goes out to him and I don't have to deal with regrets later on. My ego is neutralized as I come to understand his troubles. The greatest gift I receive from all of this is that, as I apply this to all of *Those Other People*, I seem to allow myself the same latitude without even expecting it since at one time, I was *That Other Person*. *Self forgiveness and peace of mind* seems to be the natural result of my efforts. I can accept everyone just as they are and not mess with God's work.



## Central Committee Minutes June 6th, 2021

The meeting started at 7:00 PM. We opened with a moment of silence followed by the serenity prayer. The readings read included the AA preamble, The Purpose of Central Committee and the 12 traditions.

There were 23 groups represented: Buffalo group, Grace and Dignity, Room to Grow, Come as You are, Kitchen Table, Action Group, Tuesday Men’s Discussion, Carrying the Message, Dunkirk Monday Night, Lake-shore, Amherst Snyder, Clarence Men’s Discussion (I and II), Renewal, Abbott Men’s Discussion, Matt Talbot, Step Action Group, Soul Purpose Group, Acceptance/Welcome group, Chapter IX, Depth and Weight, Easy Does It, and the Thruway group.

### Reports:

**Envelope system:** May income: \$696. There are 44 contributing members. (Alan D.)

**Steering committee:** 6 members met. Zone 4 is open and in need of a steering rep. We need a chair for the public information committee, corrections committee, and education and participation. There was no new business.

Financial report: See attached report from Joe D.

**Treatment:** 6/6/2021. Meeting started at approximately 5:35pm, Eight people were in attendance for meeting: Mark T. treatment committee co-chair, HG South Buffalo Group, Ian H. HG Lighten Up, Jesse S. HG Kitchen Table, Karl S. HG Saturday Night Alive, Cul-len HG Room to Grow (filling in for Cory), Julie HG Matt Talbot, Patrick K. (Area 50 Treatment Chair), Brenna V. (HG Depth and Weight, treatment rep for Depth and Weight). Old business: We reviewed how going into treatment facilities has been going. Julie brought up that Matt Talbot had previously had a commitment at ECMC and may be interested in taking another commitment (possibly Tuesday at ECMC). Mark T. states that he has reached out Renee at ECMC multiple times and has not yet heard back regarding taking more commitments at ECMC (Monday, Tuesday, and Saturday if possible). TFC still has approximately \$1,100. New business: Saturday Night Alive has taken commitment for 1st Friday of the month at Stutzman. Lighten Up has taken commitment for 2nd Friday of the month at Stutzman. Matt Talbot is taking 3rd Friday of the month at Stutzman (was not previously filled). Depth and Weight has taken 4th Friday of the month at Stutzman. We discussed if a different group may want to take the 5th Friday of the month at Stutzman, which would likely be only a few times a year. Jesse S. suggested making sure we have new groups to fill commitments before taking on/accepting commitments. Discussed splitting up ECMC commitments between more groups – Mark T. from South Buffalo Group and Jesse S. from Kitchen Table to coordinate with each other and discuss possible “trading off” commitment every other Wednesday for ECMC. Mark T. brought up potentially having a cook out to use some of the money that treatment committee currently has. Also discussed: Dividing up ECMC current commitments a bit more between more groups, still looking in to taking more days at ECMC (Monday, Tuesday, Saturday). TFC members are encouraged to continue connecting with other home group members and inform them that TFC is meeting and to get involved if they are interested.



**Tradition Seven: Every AA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.**

- Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?
- Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?
- If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity

**Concept VII: The Charter and Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments, empowering the trustees to manage and conduct world service affairs. The Conference Charter is not a legal document; it relies upon tradition and the A.A. purse for final effectiveness.**

- Do we act responsibly regarding the "power of the purse"?
- Do we realize that the practical and spiritual power of the Conference will nearly always be superior to the legal power of the G.S.B.?
