Lightening Rod for Controversy?

A lack of group conscience meetings in her homegroup led her to the Twelve Concepts

Without notifying our home group that we would be voting that day, a handful of people had voted to move our large meeting to a space that was simply too small for us. It was a sly trick to call for the vote. My first reaction was shock and despair. I was sick at heart.

I just wanted to run away. Wasn't that what I had always done with alcohol, escape from the harsher realities?

As the group's treasurer, I planned to take the books to the next meeting, throw them down on the floor and say, "I quit!" I would start going to different meetings, never again joining a home group. I would be a meeting gypsy, adrift.

What about my AA way of life, my program? Shouldn't I strive to be one among many, a worker among workers? I should prove I was a good sport, by acting like someone who could lose with style. Our coins say, "To thine own self be true." What was my truth?

Fortunately, before I could take any action, I got the flu. For a week, I stayed home licking my wounds and nursing my resentments.

One morning I woke up and remembered my sponsor and two other women had asked if I had been given the opportunity to express the "minority opinion."

"No," I had dejectedly responded to each of them, "I wasn't." That morning, I asked myself, "What exactly is the minority opinion?"

I did some research and was told to read page 574 of the Big Book. I opened up my book and there were "The Twelve Concepts," of which I knew literally nothing. "Concept V. The Right of Appeal" says, "minority opinion will be heard and personal grievances receive careful consideration." What did that mean? The pamphlet, "The Twelve Concepts for World Service Illustrated," explained it quite simply: "every member has a voice." And how "a simple majority is seldom sufficient basis for a decision." The minority opinion means: "to make sure the minority has a second opportunity to present its views." But the kicker for me was: "It is incumbent upon...Trusted Servants!...in their own meetings to pay special deference to the minority voice." What could I possibly do? I felt my Higher Power had guided me to the Concepts. Now what?

Up until then, our home group did not have a regular group conscience. "They're divisive," it had been explained to me. We resorted to it whenever a big issue came up—which was rare. As a result, our group really did not know how to handle sensitive issues. We looked to our old-timers, members who first formed the meeting, to simply decide it us.

For a while I stayed home, rested, prayed, meditated. How could I present the opinion that my voice had not been heard, and the location was inadequate?

One of the Promises on page 84 of the Big Book is, "We will intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle us." An idea came to me: what if I invited the group to meet at the other bigger, more modern, room for a 'trial run'?

I called my sponsor and told her my idea. She supported, and guided, me. "Can you accept the outcome, no matter what happens?" she asked.

Then I made a flyer with the address, and time, for the trial run of our meeting. I ran off 50 copies and wrote a letter to my group, explaining Concept V and asserting The Right of Appeal.

As I drove to my AA meeting that morning, I felt like a little girl going to confront her mother: I was both thrilled and terrified. I said the Serenity Prayer like a mantra.

It happened to be a Friday anniversary meeting around Halloween. The room was packed, some people were in costume; it was absolutely surreal! Only my sponsor knew of my plan. I carried a big satchel containing the fliers, maps, and copies of "The Right of Appeal." Beside myself with indecision, I kept jumping up and going out of the room. Should I read my letter or do nothing?

My sponsor and sponsee were beside me as the meeting unfurled slowly, so slowly. First came the readings, then the coins were given out, and finally the discussion portion began. Suddenly it was my turn to speak. I said, "As your treasurer, what I am about to do is very hard for me." With a shaking voice I made the Appeal. Then, I sent the copies out into the room.

It was like a bomb had exploded in the room, and pandemonium ensued. One man screamed in my face, "Why don't you just go start your own meeting!"

"Because this is my home group!" I answered.

A woman told me this would destroy our group. Another woman came up and thanked me for showing such courage. My sponsor told me, "Stop and really hear what she just said to you. Take a deep breath and take in all of this."

"You awoke the sleeping giant of the Group Conscience," a man at Central Office explained to me later. "You roused them from their lethargy."

After I emailed "The Right of Appeal" out to our phone list, I was bombarded with emails from friend and foe. I tried not to argue with anyone, practicing restraint of tongue and pen.

"Just come to the meeting and hear the minority opinion," I pleaded with them.

"Who do you think you are?" one person emailed me. "You are a mere accountant of the money."

That is where Concept III came in, "The Right to Decide" also in the same Pamphlet. It says, "We trust our trusted servants to decide how they will interpret and apply their own authority to each particular problem." AA's 12 Concepts for World Service gave me The Right to Decide to assert The Right of Appeal. Wild!

During the entire adventure I was blown away by the wisdom, and foresight, of those AA's who came before us, conceived, and wrote The Twelve Concepts.

After the trial run our home group members called another group conscience meeting, careful to invite all. As a lightning rod of controversy, I kept my mouth shut, did not debate, and took notes.

The initial vote to move the meeting place was rescinded. Member after member spoke about their love for our group, not wanting to split up, and how much we needed the bigger room. Others declared the smaller space "big enough," and beloved, as one of our first rooms from many years ago.

A second meeting was scheduled to vote on whether to stay or move. At that meeting those who wanted the little place announced they were starting a new group. The final vote taken was unanimous in favor of the big room. After a couple of years, most everyone is on speaking terms.

I now know how important regularly scheduled Group Conscience meetings are for practicing the principles and Traditions in AA. My home group has one every month.

And I will never forget learning about The Concepts in Action. I thank my Higher Power who guided me to be curious about the minority opinion.



Central Committee Minutes April 3rd, 2022

The meeting was opened by chairperson Nick @ 7:00 pm. We opened with the Responsibility Declaration followed by a moment of silence and the serenity prayer. Readings read; included the AA preamble read by Dean, The Purpose of Central Committee read by Cassie and the 12 traditions read by Jessie.

Courtney presented on Tradition 4 "Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole." Josh will present Tradition 5, in May.

Motion: was made to accept the minutes as written

Reports:

Envelope System: Pat chair reported took in \$1,015.00 grand total \$3,045.00

Steering Committee: Jessie Chair reported Met on 4.3.22 all standing reps (6) co-chair, Chair, and executive secretary. Each zone rep gave report of their zone.

Financial Report: March our Starting Checkbook balance was \$35,025.69. We took in \$3,468.99 (which is **down**) in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$1015.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$3,162.58 (which is **up**). New Frontiers was \$80.00 in subscriptions. Total income of **\$7,797.57** (which is **down**).

Our expenses totaled **\$12,173.50** (which is a very high as foretold last month). This means, we took in **\$4,375.93** less than our expenses this month. - Do I ever cop out by saying, "I'm not a group, so this or that Tradition doesn't apply to me"?
- Am I willing to explain firmly to a newcomer the limitations of AA help, even if he gets mad at me for not giving him a loan?
- Have I today imposed on any AA member for a special favor or consideration simply because I am a fellow alcoholic?
- Am I willing to twelfth-step the next newcomer without regard to who or what is in it for me?
- Do I help my group in every way I can to fulfill our primary purpose?
- Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer? Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?

Intergroup wants to express our appreciation for those groups and individuals who have made generous financial contributions, and give a special thank you to all the members who have volunteered their time this year to help the sick and suffering alcoholic.

Concept V: Throughout our structure, a traditional "Right of Appeal" ought to prevail, so that minority opinion will be heard and personal grievances receive careful consideration.

- Do we encourage the minority opinion, the "Right of Appeal," to be heard at our home group, district committee meetings, area assemblies and the Conference?
- What does our group accept as "substantial unanimity"?
- Has our group experienced the "tyranny of the majority" or the "tyranny of the minority"?
- Does our group understand the importance of all points of view being heard before a vote is taken?
