The Phenomenon of Alcohol Craving: The Case for Total Abstinence

The Big Book on page xxiv (The Doctor's Opinion) says that an alcoholic has an "allergy to alcohol." An allergy is an abnormal reaction to any food, liquid, or substance. If nine out of ten people have one reaction and one out of ten people have a different reaction, then the reaction of the one out of ten is abnormal.

It also says on page xxvi that "the action of alcohol on an alcoholic is a manifestation of an allergy; that the phenomenon of craving is *limited* to this class and *never* occurs in the average temperate drinker." (A phenomenon is something that you can see but can't explain.) "These allergic types can *never* safely use alcohol in *any form at all*."

Then on page 22, "We know that while the alcoholic keeps away from a drink, as he may do for months or years, he reacts much like other men. We are equally positive that once he takes *any alcohol whatever* into his system, something happens, both in the bodily and mental sense, which makes it virtually impossible for him to stop." This includes substances that contain alcohol like mouthwash, cold remedies, some chocolates, food prepared with alcohol, etc. Your body doesn't know if you are having a drink or taking Nyquil for a cold, it only senses alcohol and begins to process it.

It also says on page xxviii that, "all the different classifications of alcoholics have *one* symptom in common: they *cannot* start drinking without developing the phenomenon of craving. This phenomenon may be the manifestation of an allergy which differentiates these people, and sets them apart as a distinct entity." Dr. William D. Silkworth, M.D. who at that time had nine years of experience specializing in the treatment of alcoholics and drug addicts, wrote this in the late 1930s. He called it a "phenomenon of craving" because at that time there was no way to study metabolism. Since then, science has proven his theory as correct.

The following is an explanation of what happens when alcoholics put alcohol into their bodies, and how it is a completely different experience compared to non-alcoholics. No wonder why non-alcoholics can't relate and make statements like, "Can't you just stop after one or two drinks?" It shows why alcoholics can use their willpower against everything except alcohol.

What Happens When Alcoholics Take Alcohol: The Role of Acetate in Alcohol Cravings

Alcoholics make up about 12% of the population. The body of the alcoholic is physically different. The liver and pancreas of the alcoholic process alcohol at one-third to one-tenth the rate of a normal pancreas and liver.

Now as alcohol enters the body, it breaks down into various components, one of which is acetate. We know now that acetate triggers a craving for more acetate. In a normal drinker, the acetate moves through the system quickly and exits. But that doesn't happen in an alcoholic. In alcoholics, the acetate of the first drink is barely processed out, so by staying in their body, it triggers a craving for more acetate. The alcoholic then has a second drink, now adding to most of the acetate of the first drink, and that makes them want a drink twice as much as the normal drinker. So they have another. Then, having almost three times the craving as a normal drinker, they have another.

You can see from that point how alcoholics have no control over how much they drink. The craving cycle has begun and they have no choice but to keep drinking. Once the acetate accumulates in their body, and that begins to happen with only *one* drink, they will crave another. And how many times does an alcoholic think it would be nice to have *just one* drink to relax, but has many more? Now you see why. *And this can never change*.

How the Progressive Nature of Alcoholism Plays a Part

On top of *that* (like so far it's not bad enough), alcohol is a poison because it destroys human tissue. The two organs that alcohol damages the most are the liver and the pancreas. So the more the alcoholic drinks as time passes (or doesn't drink, because the liver and pancreas also deteriorate naturally as we age), the less their body is able to processes the acetate. *That* is why alcoholism is a progressive, fatal illness.

Bill W. says on page 30, "We are convinced to a man that alcoholics of our type are in the grip of a progressive illness. Over any considerable period, we get worse, never better." Pretty revealing, huh? It explains many things I never before understood.

But if you think about it, we never have to deal with *any* of this if we *don't* put alcohol into our bodies in the first place. So the *main* problem of the alcoholic centers in their mind and in their spiritual condition. My mind tells me it's okay to *take* the first drink and doesn't see that what I'm about to do is harmful (otherwise known as the obsession or powerlessness), and if I'm *not* spiritually fit I can't *stand* being sober because it's too uncomfortable (otherwise known as unmanageability). Coincidentally, the 12-Steps deal *directly* and *effectively* with both.

So that's what it means to be an alcoholic – I can't handle drinking and I can't handle not drinking.



Central Committee Minutes January 8th, 2023

Reports:

Envelope System: Pat reported 2022 year end total of \$9729. December 2022 total \$659.

Steering Committee: Steering Committee Member Jesse reported 2 zone members were present along with financial and Central Office Secretary. Central office will be lowering the cost of the Big Book by \$1 for as long as it is financially capable.

Financial Report: December our Starting Checkbook balance was \$45,932.02. We took in \$8,758.73 (which **down**) in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$658.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$1796.71 (which is **down**). New Frontiers Subscriptions was \$33.00. Joint meeting (Central Committee) was \$49.00.Total income of \$8,758.73 (which is **down**).

Our expenses totaled **\$9,630.72**(which is **about same**). This means, we took in **\$871.99 less** than our expenses this month. **YTD \$10,986.29 more than our expenses!!!!** Final checkbook balance is \$45,060.03.

*Corrections beginning balance was \$3,513.60. Income was \$.00, A \$3.00 Bank Fee, for a balance of \$3,513.60.

*Treatment beginning balance was \$751.60. Contribution's totaled \$444.00, a \$3.00 bank fee for a final balance of \$1,192.60.

When My Desperation Outweighed My Denial



Alcoholism is often referred to as a disease of perception. And, oh, how I find that statement to be true!

Like most Alcoholics, early in my drinking days, I did not have a problem. I was single and had no one to answer to, and it was perfectly normal to go directly from work to the barroom and spend the evening pouring alcohol down my throat.

It was fun, and I did a lot of foolish things in those days. As my tolerance for alcohol grew, I developed a pattern of drinking where I could open a bar at 6:00 a.m. and close it at 2:00 a.m. You could not tell that I had been drinking unless you smelled the alcohol on my breath. I reached the pinnacle, but that lasted only for a while.

Next, I developed a pattern of forgetting what happened the night before (blackout drinking) and when people started telling me about things I did during blackouts, it was not flattering. Normal drinkers do not have those kinds of experiences.

Then came the DUIs, the nights in jail, the wrecked cars, the broken knuckles, marriage, divorce and... I could go on forever.

When I was in the throes of this disease, I was living by the dictates of my ego to bolster my pride. And it was telling me that I did not have a problem. But normal drinkers must not wake each morning to face the "hideous Four Horsemen, Terror, Bewilderment, Frustration, and Despair," as the Big Book puts it. (p. 151)

For me, at that time, alcohol seemed to be the solution to my problems and to abandon it would be more horrifying. My perception was that, if I quit drinking, I would spend the rest of my life waking up in that emotional pit. I did everything in my power to deny my condition.

The progression of the malady varies in each individual due to environmental issues. Some people can drink into their 60s and 70s before they come to Alcoholics Anonymous.

Yet as the progression wore on, one by one, I was running out of options. Drinking could no longer mask the deception of it all, and I was backed into the corner of life. What could I do?

On October 15, 1969, my <u>desperation</u> outweighed my denial. I dialed the telephone operator and asked for the number of Alcoholics Anonymous. She gave me the number of a local AA club in a little house about six miles from my apartment. I showed up there to be greeted by three people sitting on a bench in the front yard. Within ten minutes of talking to them, and seeing the compassion and empathy in their eyes, I laid down in the grass, covered my eyes with my forearm and thought to myself, "Thank God, this nightmare is over!" And it was.

Ever since that moment, I have never drunk, nor wanted to drink, alcohol.

I was 28 years old at the time. Most of the members of that group were older than 40. They referred to me as the fortunate one, and I was.

From that moment on, I have done a 180 degree turn in my thinking and embraced the program of AA in its entirety, which has evolved into a life of peace and <u>serenity</u> that I could not have imagined when I showed up on that lawn in 1969. Right now, as I am trying to explain this miracle, I am wiping tears of joy from my eyes just thinking about it. Go figure.
