Buffalo Central Gets It Done!

The May issue of the New Frontiers is devoted to Central Office for the happy reason that the office's birthday is May 1942. That makes your office 81 years old this year, which is a great tribute to the A.A. members of Buffalo/ Niagara Frontier who organized the office and who have kept it running all these years.

Ideally, operating Central Office is one of the main ways that we all pursue our primary purpose in A.A. The office is a service center with the sole objective of helping groups reach out to suffering alcoholics.

How do we do that? The meeting directory lets people know where we are—and where they can come for help. The answering attendant does the same thing—anyone in the WNY area who wants to be freed from alcohol can call our office, to learn how he or she can find help through A.A.

To make sure that groups have everything they need to carry A.A.'s message, the office stocks Conference-approved literature.

To help one another stay sober, we maintain the 12-step list so that members have the opportunity to help themselves by helping others, we publish the New Frontiers so we can all share our recoveries with one another, and we offer service opportunities to A.A. members throughout the area.

Currently, the office gets about 2,500 calls a year. In the past it was much more before the internet. I was told to view each website hit as a phone call... WOW!!!!

If, over the past 81 years, we have averaged, say, 3,000 calls a year, it would mean that our Central Office has responded to almost half a million inquiries about A.A. Of this half of a million, about 10 per cent are 12-step calls. Over 81 years, that would total almost 50,000 callers who have reached out—and found—the hand of A.A.

Unfortunately (Or who knows? Some of us would say we were very fortunate to have been alcoholics and found A.A.), alcoholism is a growth business. We can be pretty sure that there are at least another quarter of a million people out there who will need our help over the next 81 years. And with the constant help of the A.A. members of the Buffalo Niagara Frontier Area, we can also be pretty sure that our Central Office will be there to answer those calls, because:

When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. And for that: I am responsible

Q . What services does Central Office & Central Committee provide?



Buffalo Central Committee has an office which was established and is maintained by A.A. groups in the area. The office provides services to over 300 groups/ week in our area. The

Executive Secretary is paid to keep the office open—all—Supports 12th step work.

Some of the services provided by the office are:

- Answers telephone calls from alcoholics, family members and members of A.A. fellowship as well as those in the helping professions.
- Publishes an accurate, up-to-date list of A.A. meetings
- Sells, packages and ships GSO and A.A. Grapevine literature as well as anniversary medallions.
- Supports 12-step Committees in their efforts and is the contact for many prisons/ institutions/schools/health fairs, etc.
- Supports Intergroup's Special Events such as the Annual Convention in the fall .
- Prepares flyers, reports, calendars for the A.A. fellowship and at the Reps meetings
- Keeps accurate records of contributions and thanks each group individually.
- Creates, publishes our monthly newsletter 'New Frontiers'.
- Provides housing, and displays for our Area 50, WNY, GSA Archives.
- Maintains group histories and information
- Maintains an active volunteer staff for answering the telephone or helping the office staff.
- Works with the website committee to help ensure, accurate, up to date information.
- Greets visitors daily.

HOW DID YOU FIND A.A.?

How did you first hear about Alcoholics Anonymous? If you lived in the Buffalo / Niagara Frontier Area, most likely the Area Central Committee/Office was involved.

Did you call on the phone?

If you called during the day, the **office staff** or one of our **phone volunteers** answered the phone. If you called after office hours, the **answering attendant service contacts the Nightwatch Volunteer**. They have people set up to answer your call. All of these people in service are Intergroup volunteers.

Buffalo Central Office phone number was in the telephone book...or on a website?

Also, the **Public Information Committee** they also are responsible for running **Public Service Announcements** and their members attend **Health Fairs** where our brochures are available. They also go to area schools and talk to students about AA.

Did your doctor or your minister/priest or a judge suggest A.A.?

If so, the **P.I.C./ C.P.C. (Public Information/ Cooperation with the Professional Committee)** probably helped you. This committee operates with volunteers. Their mission is to inform the professionals in our area about A .A.

Did you attend A.A. meetings while you were in detox, rehab or a mental institution ?

If so, more than likely Buffalo Central Committee was involved. The **Treatment Facilities Committee** organizes A.A. meetings in the area institutions every week.

Did you hear the A.A. message while you were incarcerated in one of our local prisons?

If so, Buffalo Central Committee **Corrections Committee** was responsible for taking meetings behind the walls. We have commitments at area prisons every week. It is by taking a meeting into these facilities that many who cannot otherwise get to a meeting will be granted that same privilege as you have.

Central Committee Minutes April 2nd, 2023

I am Responsible . . . When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help
I want the hand of AA to be there,
And for that, . . . I Am Responsible

The meeting opened at 7:00 PM by Chairperson Dave with a moment of silence followed by the Responsibility Declaration and the Serenity Prayer. Volunteers read the Preamble by Garrett, The Purpose of Central Committee by Jan, and The 12 Traditions was read by Dean. Mike from Rise & Shine presented on the Fourth Tradition. Bernie from Buffalo Early Birds will present on the 5th Tradition in

May.

The Following 26 Groups were represented: Carry the Message, Daily Maintenance, Derby Group, Lakeshore, Language of the Heart, 10-11-12, Arcade/Yorkshire, Orchard Park Step, Matt Talbot, South Buffalo, Southgate, Thruway, Valley, Daily Reflections, Depth & Weight, Easy Does It, North Buffalo, Sober Train, Buffalo, Rise and Shine, Sundays Best, Sunday Morning Breakfast, High View, Soul Purpose, Williamsville, Lockport #1 Group, Lockport Ladies

A motion to accept the March meeting minutes as presented was made and accepted.

\$41 taken in for 7th tradition

Reports:

Envelope System: Chairperson Pat reported \$232 taken in and that more members are needed.

Steering Committee: Chairperson Steve had no report to present.

Financial Report: After reconciled report; I had some errors from presented report...I missed a payroll entry. Also there was and overage in the Sales tax account. It all shows as the sales tax expenses and a deposit in (Income +) line of \$253.76 in income. This is the reconciled report, corrected from the time of presentation.

March: our Starting Checkbook balance was \$41,050.21. We took in \$6,212.75 (which is **down**) in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$732.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$3,457.93 (which is **up**). New Frontiers Subscriptions was \$90.00. Joint meeting (Central Committee) was \$78.00. In Income (+) \$253.76 was added to our income from an overage in the sales tax in QB, zeroing it out when sales tax was paid. Total income of **\$10,824.44**.

Our expenses totaled **\$12,228.21** (which is **up**). This means, we took in **\$1,403.77 less** than our expenses this month. **YTD we are down \$5,413.77 less than our expenses!!!!** Final checkbook balance is \$39,646.44.

Corrections beginning balance was \$3,289.60. Income was \$50.00, A \$3.00 Bank Fee, for a balance of **\$3,289.60**.

Treatment beginning balance was \$1,011.60. Contribution's totaled \$120.00, Literature was \$394.50, a \$3.00 bank fee for a final balance of **\$734.10**.

Treatment: Co-chair Garrett presented that the treatment committee met on April 2nd with 12 homegroup members represented. \$734.10 with \$120 for contributions in March. Reflections is now closed FYI. Discussed and suggested what works and overall no major issues with any current commitments. We suggest if a group is interested in treatment or wants to know more have someone go to meeting at 5:30 before Central Committee.
