Twelve Spiritual Principles (Virtues)

The office was recently contacted by a long-timer who pointed out that the following article provides a list of spiritual **virtues** (not principles) that originated from a plaque which was sold years ago and may originally come from a Grapevine article or other AA newsletter. It is known in the rooms of AA that the spiritual principles are the Twelve Steps. To be thorough, the 36 principles are the Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts.

There are many different spiritual virtue lists that refer to the Twelve Steps which have been printed by other AA's over the years.

Although used by many AA members, they are not Conference Approved and the origin of these lists are unknown.



Bill W. considered each step to be a spiritual principle in and of itself. However, particularly in the 12 & 12, he outlined the spiritual principles behind each step. Some of them seem like common sense, but understand going into the exercise that reading these principles and actually *practicing them in your day-to-day lives* are two entirely different things (and that the latter requires vigilance and willingness).

HONESTY – Fairness and straight forwardness of conduct: adherence to the facts.

HOPE – To expect with desire; something on which hopes are centered.

FAITH – Complete confidence; belief and trust.

COURAGE – Firmness of mind and will in the face of extreme difficulty; mental or moral strength to withstand fear.

INTEGRITY – The quality or state of being complete or undivided; soundness.

WILLINGNESS – Prompt to act or respond; accepted and done of choice or without reluctance.

HUMILITY – Not proud or haughty; not arrogant or assertive; a clear and concise understanding of what we are, followed by a sincere desire to become what we can be.

LOVE – Unselfish concern that freely accepts another in loyalty and seeks his good to hold dear.

DISCIPLINE – Training that corrects, molds, or perfects the mental faculties or moral character; to bring under control; to train or develop by instruction.

PATIENCE/PERSEVERANCE – Steadfast despite opposition or adversity; able or willing to bear; to persist in an understanding in spite of counter influences.

AWARENESS – Alive and alert; vigilance in observing.

SERVICE – A helpful act; contribution to the welfare of others; useful labor that does not produce a tangible commodity.

A.A. Historical Events in December

Dec 1-1940 – Chicago Daily Tribune begins a series of articles on AA by Nell Hamilton.
Dec 5-1985 – Dave B, founder of Montreal Group, dies weeks before 50th anniversary. His story was added to the 4th Edition Big Book.
Dec 6-1939 – Bert the Tailor lends Works Publishing \$1000.
Dec 6-1979 – Akron Beacon reports death of Henrietta Sieberling.
Dec 7-1949 – Sister Ignatia received Poverello Medal on behalf of A.A.
Dec 10-1975 – Birds of a Feather AA group for pilots is formed.
Dec 11-1934 – Bill admitted to Towns Hospital for the fourth and last time (fall '33, '34 in summer, midsummer and final admittance).
Dec 11-1941 – Dallas Morning News reports first AA group formed in Dallas.
Dec 12-1934 – Bill has Spiritual Experience at Towns Hospital.
Dec 12-1937 – Bill meets with Rockefeller Foundation and tries to get money.
Dec 13-1937 – Rockland State Mental Hospital takes patients to meeting in New Jersey.
Dec 13 or 14-1934 – Ebby visits Bill at Towns hospital, brings William James' book, Varieties of Religious Experience.
Dec 19-1939 – Los Angeles held their first AA meeting there.
Dec 20-1945 – Rowland H. dies (he carried the Oxford Group message to Ebby).
Dec 27-1893 – Rev. Samuel Shoemaker is born.

Other December happenings with no specific date:

Dec 1934 – Bill & Lois start attending Oxford Group meetings.
Dec 1934 to May 1935 – Bill works with alcoholics, but fails to sober any of them. Lois reminds him HE is sober.
Dec 1938 – Twelve Steps written.
Nov/Dec 1939 – Akron group withdraws from association with Oxford Group. Meetings moved from T. Henry & Clarence Williams' home to Dr Bob and other members' homes.
Dec 1939 – First AA group in mental institution, Rockland State Hospital, NY.
Dec 1939 – First home meeting in Los Angeles at Kaye M.'s house.
Dec 1939 – Matt Talbot Club has 88 members, uses wagons to collect old furniture to recondition & sell, not A.A., used A.A. program, material, marked first effort reach alcoholics outside married, middle-class category.
Dec 1940 – First AA group formed in St. Louis, Missouri.
Dec 1940 – Group started Ashtabula, Ohio due to Plain Dealer articles. A.A. Cleveland has about 30 groups.
Dec 1948 – Dr. Bob's last major talk, in Detroit.
Dec 1950 – Grapevine article signed by both Bill and Dr Bob recommend establishing AA General Service Conference.
Dec 1955 – Man on the Bed painting by Robert M. first appeared in Grapevine. Painting originally called Came to Believe.
Dec 1982 – Nell Wing retires from GSO after 35 years of service.

Central Committee Minutes November 5th , 2023

The meeting opened at 7:00 PM by Chairperson Dave with a moment of silence followed by the Responsibility Declaration and the Serenity Prayer. Volunteers that read were the Preamble by Dean, The Purpose of Central Office by Mary Claire, and The 12 Traditions by Jim. Tradition 11 was presented by Bernie. Mary Claire will be presenting on the 12th Tradition in

December.

A motion to accept the meeting minutes as presented was made and accepted.

Four New Representatives were present for the following groups: CPR Group, Silver Creek/Friendship, Questions & Answers, and Iron-horse

7th Tradition took in \$90.00

Reports:

Envelope System : Chairperson Pat advised that \$497 were brought in. This is down from the previous month.

Steering Committee: Steve provided oral report. No written report provided.

Financial Report: This is the reconciled report

October; our Starting Checkbook balance was \$45,937.69. We took in \$ 5,378.77 (which is **down**) in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$497.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$2,722.00 (which is **up**). New Frontiers Subscriptions was \$56.00. Joint meeting (Central Committee) was \$39.00. The Convention after seed money was returned, brought in \$6111.02 (thank God for bad service and an adjusted bill or we would have lost the seed money) Our Total income of **\$15,168.79** (which is **up**).

Our expenses totaled **\$7,162.75** (which is **down**). This means, we took in **\$8,006.04 more** than our expenses this month. **YTD we are up \$8,883.70 more than our current expenses.** Final checkbook balance is \$53,943.73.

Corrections beginning balance was \$2,564.10. Income= \$10. Expenses; \$100.00 an a \$3.00 Bank Fee, for a balance of \$2,471.10.

Treatment beginning balance was \$2,032.07. Contribution's totaled \$516. A \$3.00 bank fee, for a final balance of \$2,545.07.

Our lives had become unmanageable

The first requirement is that we be convinced that any life run on self-will can hardly be a success. On that basis, we are almost always in collision with something or somebody, even though our motives are good. Most people try to live by self-propulsion. Each person is like an actor who wants to run the whole show; is forever trying to arrange the lights, the ballet, the scenery, and the rest of the players in his own way. If his arrangements would only stay put, if only people would do as he wished, the show would be great. Everybody, including himself, would be pleased. Life would be wonderful. In trying to make these arrangements, our actor may sometimes be quite virtuous. He may be kind, considerate, patient, generous; even modest, and self-sacrificing. On the other hand, he may be mean, egotistical, selfish, and dishonest. But, as with most humans, he is more likely to have varied traits.

What usually happens? The show doesn't come off very well.

- Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior – especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- What is the real importance of me among more than a million AAs?
