In A.A. November is Gratitude Month

For many decades now, A.A. has formally set aside all of November as Gratitude Month as a time to express our collective gratitude for our individual sobriety.

The history of gratitude month dates back to the 1940s when the General Service Board hosted small "Gratitude Dinners." In the November 1949 Grapevine, Bill W. made a suggestion that Thanksgiving week be adopted as Tradition Week during which special attention will be paid to the Traditions. You can read more about this in

the **Box 459 — Oct-Nov 2000 issue**.

By the 1960s they had become larger, more elaborate "Gratitude Luncheons." The motivation behind these gatherings was to express personal gratitude for sobriety and appreciation to our professional friends for their articles, books, radio and T.V. interviews relating to A.A. over the past year.

Though the luncheons were discontinued in 1968, the concept of gratitude persisted and expanded in scope marking the occasion with special contributions to G.S.O., though there is no proscribed manner for celebrating Gratitude Month.

Groups are encouraged to come up with their own imaginative ways to foster an attitude of gratitude among the fellowship. The **Box 459 — Oct-Nov '94 issue** put it so well: "How about trying something new, something your group has never done before, which will make the members' gratitude more tangible and real?"

So how about it? What kind of new and creative actions can you and your groups take to honor Gratitude Month?

My thoughts always gave me an excuse to continue my freedom to drink. It was not necessarily plain to see; this disease is cunning and hides in the back of our thoughts and waits. Unnoticeably, drinking was connected to everything I did.

Did I see it? Did I know my thinking was twisted by my cravings? No! I was lost in a fog and couldn't see the truth. Why would I think spending my whole paycheck and more from our savings was a normal way to live? A DWI didn't matter, nor being thrown out of my home seems to be too terrible and all the people yelling at me because I was destroying everything and everyone around me. None of that seemed important.

How distorted this disease can make our thoughts and decisions? My thinking, and our thinking under the influence of Alcohol (and more) is far from acceptable behavior. Just what the hell were we thinking? Being sober for a while now has opened my eyes to see clearly (lifting the fog). I NOW AM MORE RESPONSIBLE, MORE CARING, MORE DETERMINED TO BE HELPFUL TO OTHER SINCE I HAVE PUT THE DRINK DOWN!

Being grateful for a power greater than I am, is a big step to recovering! What a difference. Who would have thought how beautiful and fulfilling life can be by only following directions and guidance from others – stunning! I'm looking through new eyes – or a new "pair of glasses" that I have heard about, to reap the rewards and happiness from this style of thinking in this wonderful program! Sometimes I wish this would have come sooner, but that would only shorten the experience I can share with you.

In closing make your decisions with no regrets. If you and I are truthful about our thinking, we will have those "new glasses" to see through!





Envelope System: Chairperson Pat noted that \$497.00 brought in for August.

Steering Committee: Verbal report given, no written report provided.

Financial Report: August; our Starting Checkbook balance was \$44,953.58. We took in \$ 6,204.26 (which is **down**) in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$497.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$2,626.54 (which is **up**). New Frontiers Subscriptions was \$20.00. Joint meeting (Central Committee) was \$55.00. Total income of **\$9,402.80** (which is **down**).

Our expenses totaled **\$7,936.20** (which is **down**). This means, we took in **\$1,466.60 more** than our expenses this month. **YTD we are up \$1,360.15 more than our current expenses.** Final checkbook balance is \$46,420.18. FYI, Next month we will have a large literature order and ordering paper, so next month we probably will be down again L

Treatment beginning balance was \$1,635.00. Contribution's totaled \$352.00. Literature was 390.00 and a \$3.00 bank fee for a final balance of \$1,594.38.
