Stuck In Their Character Defects

Step Six is about stopping the struggling by letting go, letting God in to help us, praying about being willing, relaxing, continuing to return to God and AA meetings so we are not on our own. With God and prayer and the fellowship backing us up we can become ready and willing for the needed changes to take place in our life. The Sixth and Seventh Steps require ongoing practice and reflection as to how fully we are surrendering to God our thinking and what we do. Turning our will and life over to God in the 3rd Step is an active use of our will and the 6th Step is about believing that we've done this and that God will do for us what we cannot do for ourselves. Taking the 6th Step is being ready to let God have all of us and all of our defects. This is the Step as the Twelve and Twelve says that separates the men from the boys or could say the women from the girls. We are being transferred into the big leagues of spiritual heavenly living with God rocketing us into the fourth dimension of existence of which we had not even dreamed possible. Our whole attitude toward life, toward our fellows and towards God's universe will be revolutionized. The Creator is entering into our hearts and lives in a way which is indeed miraculous. And He is accomplishing those things for us which we could never do for ourselves (paraphrased from Big Book p 25).

We let go and let God decide what character defects He wants to remove from us. God uses any number of ways to get us to the help we need to do His will. We are living spiritual principles and acceptance of Gods will for us-the Twelve Steps-is what we live on a daily basis. Changing us as we live the Steps is God's job just like it is His job to open a flower and do the many natural and supernatural interventions that are required each day throughout the world and universe.

Quite often we used our character defects to get some of our needs met during our drinking days-but, as has been said, now that we are in AA working the Twelve Steps, the better we get, the less defects we have and the more improved character asset traits we receive. We can all change, we must stay abstinent from booze and mood-mind altering drugs. We supply the willingness and God supplies the personality change and removal of character defects as He sees fit so that we become winners. Winners practice a new way of thinking and living as we keep practicing the Twelve Steps, attending the AA meetings, studying recovery material so we keep the changing and growing spiritually going strong. Losers continue with old destructive behaviors and hang onto character defects never looking for solutions or how to live with God and how to get a right

relationship with Him. Losers are stuck in self-centeredness and excessively morbidly over thinking of themselves and therefore are not in a position to be open to receive Gods help. A loser can turn things around and become a winner once they quit playing God, give up self-will, become honest and work the Steps so God removes the drink problem and gives them the desire to work with Him to overcome character defects. Winners keep letting go and letting God in so they can have a supernatural high and alive thriving spiritual life.

Many people are stuck in their character defects and think that these traits are who they are. They've spent their lifetime fantasizing about who they are, and their defective character traits are well grounded in whom they have become. Our poor character defects can destroy us in the end and if we don't change and ask God to help us become willing to go to any lengths for sobriety and becoming a new creature of His we will lose our character defects once we are buried in the ground.

We can recall the words that have been shared at many AA meetings, "we either get sobered up, locked up or buried up!"

The Greatest Promise in the Big Book (see Spiritual Experience Appendix II): If you do the work you will overcome your drinking problem in 90 days or so. The exact wording is: What often takes place in a few months (this is likely where 90 meetings in 90 days came from) could seldom have been accomplished by years of self-discipline. With few exceptions our members find that they have tapped an unsuspected inner resource which they presently identify with their own conception of a Power greater than themselves. Most of us think this awareness of a Power greater than ourselves is the essence of spiritual experience. Our more religious members call it "God-consciousness." If we still cling to something we will not let go, we ask God to help us be willing.

When ready, we say something like this:

"My Creator, I am now willing that You should have all of me, good and bad. I pray that you now remove from me every single defect of character which stands in the way of my usefulness to You and my fellows. Grant me strength, as I go out from here, to do Your bidding. Amen." We have then completed Step Seven.

Now we need more action, without which we find that "Faith without works is dead." Let's look at Steps Eight and Nine. (Big Book p 76)

Note - References for this article include:

(Big Book p 72) "We have admitted certain defects; we have ascertained in a rough way what the trouble is; we have put our finger on the weak items in our personal inventory. Now these are about to be cast out."

(Big Book p 75) "We pocket our pride and go to it, illuminating every twist of character, every dark cranny of the past. Once we have taken this step, withholding nothing, we are delighted. We can look the world in the eye. We can be alone at perfect peace and ease. Our fears fall from us. We begin to feel the nearness of our Creator. 

- If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- •Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?
