Tradition Eleven

*No one told them who I was,
just what I was*

Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. ought to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principles of attraction rather than promotion. There is never a need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.

It seemed clear that to refrain from broadcasting, literally, my new participation in A.A. was a good idea. No use making it clear to all who might see how things did not work in A.A. if I “fell off the wagon.” It was even easier to understand this concept when thinking of a celebrity, which of course I was not, except in my own fantasies. Who would want to give A.A. a “bad name” if it did not work for them? But this business of attraction, not promotion, was not so clear to me.

While I did not want to shout it from the rooftops that I had finally gotten sober, I did expect to get a reward for finally doing what I should have been doing anyway. I wanted to spread the news that this worked, even in the tough case I presented. However, as my wise Uncle John had taught me years before “The devil is in the details.” So it was with me and the practice of this principle of attraction rather than promotion in my own affairs. That is, until I saw how the radiance of humility and anonymity shone through this most simple suggestion.

For who amongst your usual group of A.A.’s is a celebrity anyway? How many of us truly are worried about being caught on the nightly news, discussing candidly our sobriety, worrying whether we have mentioned the unmentionable? While I could focus on that aspect and conclude it did not apply to me until the camera was on me, I discovered this would be missing the spiritual aspect of the tradition.



As my appreciation of this concept of attraction, not promotion, evolved, I began to better understand how it nurtured humility. This was not just the stuff of Step 7, extolled to allow me to meet, sober, any emergency. Here it seemed to also mean I needed to forego that “pat on the back” for a job well done which had so often motivated my actions “before.” I was to instead be happiest in my work when seeking no attribution for it.

As that handy card noted, I was to try each day to do a good deed for someone without letting anyone know about it. This it seemed was the stuff of real humility and anonymity – what an order, can I go through with it? I was compelled to ask if this was what they were talking about

with such earnestness when they asked if I could be fearless, if I was ready to go to any length? When I began to silently hear these questions as I thought about attraction, not promotion, this tradition started to have a meaning beyond the camera lights or reporter’s questions.

It began to change the way I thought at my meetings and how I carried myself into the day after I walked out of them. I no longer cared that it was me who carried the message, only about whom my words might fall upon. I had begun to notice more actively that this trait seemed common amongst those men and women A.A.’s who had what I wanted.

A well-oiled sales pitch was not my job

For me the acid test came when I got involved with a service commitment for PI/CPC, Public Information / Cooperation with Professional Community. I began to attend meetings at DUI classes, recovery centers, and even high schools, all with the hope of carrying the message as our principles suggest. More than ever did I realize that a well-oiled sales pitch was not my job. Rather, as those who initiated me had stressed, these crowds would see right through the “blarney.” Give them my experience, strength and hope, and let their Higher Power do the rest, was the message to carry. The insights gleaned from this tradition had paved the road of communication. In fact, my job seemed to work best because no one had told them who I was, only what I was. If my message was heard, it was then truly due to attraction not promotion and the spirit of Tradition 11.

What does a Central Committee Intergroup Rep do?

- IGRs serve as the liaison between A.A. local groups and their local Intergroup.
- IGRs keep their group up-to-date with local information related to A.A. and let them know about available service opportunities.
- IGRs vote on matters that affect Intergroup and A.A. at the local level, such as money, literature, the website, Central Office and more.
- Buffalo Intergroup serves more than 400 A.A. meetings in our common purpose of carrying the A.A. message of recovery to alcoholics. Intergroup provides important services for local 12 Step work, such as running Central Office, selling A.A. literature, publishing a local meeting directory and website and operating a 24-hour telephone helpline.

NOMINATIONS



November 2nd, 2025: Nominations For The Following Positions:

- **Co-Chair Person for Central Committee**
- **Recording Secretary**
- **Steering Committee Representatives for Zones: 2, 5, 7 & 8.**
- **GSA Liaison**
- **Nightwatch**
- **Envelope System Chairperson**

The Requirements for each position are as Follows:

C. Co-Chairperson

1. The Co-Chairperson shall be elected by a simple majority vote of Central Committee Representatives or Alternates present and voting at the meeting designated for the election of officers. Nominees for the office of Recording Secretary shall be Members of Alcoholics Anonymous having a minimum of five (5) years continuous sobriety immediately preceding the date of the election. The Co-Chairperson shall serve for one year (January through December) in that office. Upon conclusion of the Co-Chairperson's year of service, that individual shall automatically succeed to the office of Chairperson in January.

D. Recording Secretary

1. The Recording Secretary shall be elected by a simple majority vote of the Central Committee Representatives present and voting at the meeting designated for the election of officers. Nominees for the office of Recording Secretary shall be Members of Alcoholics Anonymous having a minimum of two (2) years of continuous sobriety immediately preceding the date of the election. The Recording Secretary shall hold office for a one year term (January through December) and shall be eligible for re-nomination and re-election. Nominations for the office of Recording Secretary shall be made annually at the November meeting of the Central Committee. The election for this office shall be held annually at the December meeting and the elected officer shall take office in January.
2. The Recording Secretary shall have the following duties:
 - take the minutes of all proceedings at meetings of the Central Committee;
 - transcribe the minutes and have them available for review prior to the next Central Committee meeting; and
 - transmit to the Central Committee all resolutions or other communications pertaining to the business of the Central Committee.

STEERING COMMITTEE

Section 3.01 Purpose and Duties

The Steering Committee shall have the duty to advise the Central Committee on all aspects of the management of the property, affairs and business concerns of the Intergroup as well as compliance with all applicable statutes and regulations of the State of New York and in a manner consistent with these By-Laws. Such duties shall include, without limitation, ensuring the Intergroup's compliance with federal, state and local laws, protecting the Intergroup's assets and ensuring the financial viability of the Central Office, allocating the resources in the best interests of the Intergroup such that the Central Committee functions and the Central Office operates in accordance with the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of World Service of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Section 3.02 Additional Duties

- A. The Steering Committee shall provide analysis, advice and counsel on matters as requested by the Central Committee Chairperson and/or the Executive Secretary of the Central Office when, because of time and/or other considerations, such matters cannot be brought to the Central Committee.
- B. The Steering Committee is responsible and authorized to act in place of the Central Committee in emergency situations.
- C. The Steering Committee shall oversee the whole of Alcoholics Anonymous in the Area and consider whether the actions, policies, the manner of conducting meetings by groups or actions of individual A.A. Members could have an effect on local groups or Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole, as guided by the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- D. The Steering Committee shall follow through on various tasks, matters and/or issues as directed by the Central Committee.
- E. The Steering Committee shall provide summaries and reports and shall otherwise make suggestions and/or recommendations to the Central Committee.
- F. The Steering Committee shall serve as the confidential contact and liaison with the Executive Secretary of the Central Office. Such personal and confidential communication will ensure that the Executive Secretary may air his or her complaints and concerns without fear of reprisal and that the performance of the Executive Secretary may be confidentially evaluated.
- G. Qualifications
A Member of the Steering Committee must be a Member of Alcoholics Anonymous whose home group is within the District he or she is elected to represent. The individual must also have at least three (3) years of continuous sobriety before the effective date of his or her term as a Member.
- H. Term and Election

3. District Members - The term of the Members elected from the 8 Districts shall be two (2) years commencing on January 1st following his or her election and ending on December 31st of the second year of service.
- Members representing the following Districts shall be elected to terms beginning in years ending in an odd number:

District 2 North Erie County
District 3 South Buffalo & East
District 7 Buffalo East
District 8 Northeast Erie

- Members representing the following Districts shall be elected to terms beginning in years ending that end in an even number:

District 1 Buffalo West
District 4 Southeast
District 5 Niagara County
District 6 Southwest
District 7 Buffalo East

4. In the spirit of service rotation, Members may not be re-elected to two (2) consecutive terms on the Steering Committee. However, a Member once having completed and served his or her term may again be nominated and re-elected as a Member after an absence of at least one year from the Steering Committee.

5. Members of the Steering Committee (from Districts) shall be selected or elected by the Central Committee Members of the groups within the particular Districts in such manner as they shall determine.

Section 4.12 GSA Liaison

A. Purpose

The purpose of the GSA Liaison is to attend meetings between Central Committee and the General Service Area and convey information between the two bodies.

B. Term/Election

Liaison shall be elected to a 1 year term requirement of 3 years sobriety. May be reelected for 1 more term than rotate.

Section 4.08 Nightwatch - Twelfth (12th) Step Committee (Amended 8/8/11)

- A. The purpose of this committee is to recruit, train and oversee those A.A. groups or groups of A.A. individuals who have volunteered to man the phone after normal business hours of the Central Office of Buffalo.

- B. The Phone Committee shall consist of no less than three members of A.A.

- C. The officers shall be elected internally and shall meet such sobriety requirements as the Phone Committee may specify as necessary. The Chairperson shall be elected for a term of 2 years and shall be required to have at least 2 years of continuous sobriety.

- D. The duties of and responsibilities of the Phone Committee are:

1. Develop and continually update training/information manuals with the assistance of the Office Administrator.
2. Recruit A.A. groups and/or individuals to man the phone after normal office business hours.
3. Train these individuals as to their responsibilities, procedures, and requirements.
4. Promote and oversee the 'Night Watch' so as to make certain that the hand of A.A. that is extended through our phones are always that of an A.A. member. (Amended 8/8/11)

Section 4.07 Envelope System Chairperson

- A. The Envelope System was established to allow A.A. members to directly contribute monies to help defray the costs of operating the Buffalo Central Office, which in turn helps carry the message. Anonymity is kept.
- B. The Chairperson is responsible each month to record and keep records of contributions and to send out receipts and year end statements.
- C. The Committee is responsible to get information out to the membership on what the Envelope System is and how they may join.

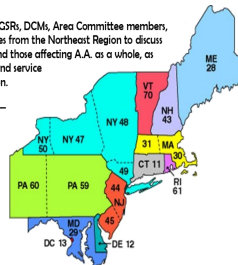

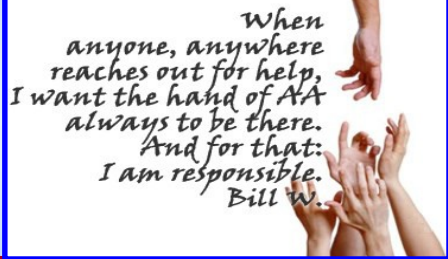

Reports

Envelope System: Terry reported. \$507 was brought in for September 2025.
