Mental Obsession (The Great *Unreality* Deep Within)

Someone wrote that an alcoholic cannot drink on the truth — only on a lie. The Big Book tells us that alcoholics have found a *Great Reality deep down within* (p. 55).

Reality infers truth! Historically, Such *Reality* protected Dr. Bob from his ever-lurking *hooker of scotch* for two and a half years...but, when I was new in AA, and still making an assessment of the Twelve Steps, I discovered many inconvenient-truths of which my ego was fain to admit, let alone allow change. Actually, I was living in a *great un-reality deep within*, which would not allow me to recognize the truth in the matter of drink

—I was irretrievably imprisoned in a lie. As Dr. Silkworth explained: “*I could not differentiate the true from the false in the matter of drink*”. (xxviii)

So, there I was; faced with the dilemma of being rid of my long-lived, truth-resisting, ego-self, or getting drunk. Yes, I was willing . . . but how to be rid of my false ego-self that for so many years served as my only defense against a threatening world?

Although I had been attending meetings regularly, the obsession to drink had not diminished one iota. One of my favorite authors stated that most people spend the first part of their lives developing a protective ego-self, but some lucky ones spend The last of their time on earth getting rid of it.



I was forty-three years old and sober about six months when a new sponsor explained that self could not rid self of self with self, so I obviously needed a *power greater than myself*. He then taught me how to give up on my false self by living the AA program of action. A few months later, I experienced the release I had so earnestly prayed for! The obsession had been lifted! Then began a lifetime process of remaining “absent” of that *great unreality deep within*. My second part of life has blissfully begun. Thank you God ~

When my Sponsor Drank

Like many lessons in sobriety, placing people in AA on pedestals is something that I did not understand the full implications of initially. I had been putting recovering alcoholics on pedestals since before I even got to . My dad, for example, had been sober twelve years before I made it to the rooms, and based on his horrendous battle with booze before AA, I was sure he was a walking miracle.

My own sobriety began a number of years later, after many physical, emotional, spiritual, and legal problems with alcohol. At that point, it was suggested I get a sponsor who had been through the Steps and lived a life that I myself wanted to live. I found somebody who seemed to fit that bill, and we soon began a daily dialogue that led to him guiding me through each of the Twelve Steps.

Weeks meshed into months as we saw each other regularly at meetings, reviewed chapters in the book, and traveled to various AA functions around our state. I listened intently to his emphasis on prayer and gratitude as I built my foundation and took a personal inventory. I completed my Fifth Step with him and proceeded through my Eighth and Ninth Steps with the selfless guidance of this man whom I regarded with in-tense respect and unending praise.

My sponsor and I met weekly as I began to incorporate a daily inventory into my sobriety and listened to him describe his own experience with meditation. Upon reaching the Twelfth Step, my sponsor asked me to look back on the journey we had gone through together and to turn to others to give away what I had received.

I found myself very energetic about sobriety and more than willing to approach newcomers. I began working closely with new men in AA while other areas of my life began to get busy. That's when I found out my sponsor had picked up a drink.

I was shocked. I could not believe that the man who had brought me through the Steps into a new way of life had drunk again. I felt lied to and betrayed. I had seen people go back to drinking since coming into the pro-gram, but in the case of my sponsor, I felt personally sick with frustration and misunderstanding.

After talking with others, I was made aware that sobriety was not guaranteed forever, and I was directed to page 85 of the Big Book, which discusses the daily reprieve we have from alcoholism and how the maintenance of an alcoholic's spiritual condition must take place on a daily basis. In the end, I realized I hadn't been betrayed at all. Instead, I had learned the important lesson that none of us are guaranteed a lifetime of sobriety and that putting someone on a pedestal can be dangerous for me and for the alcoholic I admire.

It has been over three years since this occurred, and I have tried to remain grateful for each day that I am sober, using the amazing AA principles my sponsor taught me in my first year of sobriety.

- Buffalo Intergroup serves more than 400 A.A. meetings in our common purpose of carrying the A.A. message of recovery to alcoholics. Intergroup provides important services for local 12 Step work, such as running Central Office, selling A.A. literature, publishing a local meeting directory and website and operating a 24-hour telephone helpline.

Intergroup is called the 'front lines' of A.A. because involvement with us means getting the message out first-hand. If you want to help others, try to get involved.





Central Committee Minutes December 7th, 2025

The meeting opened at 7:00pm by Chairperson Dean C. with a moment of silence followed by the Responsibility Declaration and the Serenity Prayer. Envelope System: Terry reported. \$570 was brought in for November 2025.

Financial Report : This is the Reconciled report

Nov 2025: our Starting Checkbook balance was \$43,577.56. We took in \$ 5,228.71 (which is **up** in Contributions from Groups and individuals. The Envelope System took in: \$570.00. Literature, Tax & shipping came to \$2,246.71 (which is **down**). New Frontiers Subscriptions was \$20.00. Joint meeting (Central Committee) was \$46.00. Our Total income of **\$8,111.42** (which is **down**).

Our expenses totaled **\$7,391.98** (which is **down**). This means, we took in **\$719.44 more** than our expenses this month. **YTD we are down \$4,608.86 (moved 1,608.51 into Prudent Reserve to bring it up to our average 3 month reserve, bringing the year to date #to, we are down \$3,000.35) from our current expenses for 2025.** Final checkbook balance is \$44,297.00.

Corrections beginning balance was \$894.60.. Income= \$70. Expenses; a \$3.00 Bank Fee, for a balance of \$961.60.

Treatment beginning balance was 1,077.47.47. Contribution's totaled \$214.00 Expenses: \$860.00 plus a \$3.00 bank fee, for a final balance of \$428.47.
