Step Eight Freedom



I was hesitant and puzzled when I began my Eight Step list because what about people whose feelings might be hurt or might be harmed if I admitted all—my Step Four inventory had several of those. Luckily, my sponsor informed me that Step Eight is not Step Nine, and I should not leave these activities off my list. But obviously, this did not mean that I make these harmful amends while doing Step Nine. This information may be useful in asking God for forgiveness in a later step.

My Eighth Step information came mostly from my Step Four inventory, but also my sponsor had me do a spontaneous writing earlier on. This included asking God over and over again to reveal where I had been selfish and dishonest—not just from regular memory, but from my deepest inner self. Spontaneous! This function brought to light many secrets I had kept from myself for many years. They needed to be written down.

I had seldom even considered the anguish my wonderful Christian parents must have felt to see their son's name in the newspaper for public intoxication year after year. Or my younger sister who, four years later, attended the same high school with my devil may care reputation still remembered by the teachers. I had never felt guilty about that loan company I had never paid back or the time when I, as a teen, tried out a motorcycle from a used lot and wrecked it. I was able to wobble it in and jumped on my bicycle and away I went.

There was a temptation to leave out certain misbehaviors because, after all, I had been sober for five whole months, and intended never to drink whisky again! I was obviously now in the category of what is called "living amends!" How my sponsor pointed out that the Big Book makes no mention of "living amends" it actually dispels that idea at the bottom of page 82 — "Ain't it grand the wind stopped blowin'?"

I believe the honesty revealed in my Eighth Step list was a vital and crucial part of my recovery.

Alcoholism:

The Disease that Tells You You're OK

I met with a woman the other day who told me her raw, emotional story. She had trouble stringing her thoughts together. One minute she was overflowing with gratitude to A.A.s who had met with her, escorted her around, listened to her, and comforted her. The next she was suspicious of their motives.

She recounted how she had driven drunk, and was astonished not to have been caught, feared she would hit someone and kill them, or herself. She had cheated on her husband, and was wracked with guilt. She stole from her job, by drinking in the afternoon on the company's dime, and calling it work. She had panic attacks. She cried uncontrollably.

I asked her if she felt her life was unmanageable. "I don't think so," she said, after giving it some thought.

To me, this story exemplifies how our disease lies to us. I was the same way. I sat on a therapist's couch and bemoaned how my medications weren't working. When my therapist asked whether I drank, I lied. I am not a liar, but I lied. She didn't believe me, and I think I knew I looked a fool, but I continued to lie to her.

I lied to myself—told myself I needed to drink an entire bottle of wine to get to sleep each night. My disease told me that it wasn't hard liquor; red wine was good for me, I was functioning. I twisted everything around so that I could say I was all right.

The only time my alcoholism couldn't overcome the truth was first thing in

the morning when I would wake up with a pounding head and a mouth full of cotton. I would lie in bed spinning, that sour, foul feeling coming up in my stomach, and think to myself, "How did I do this again? What is wrong with me?" And then the alcoholism would kick in, the blaming, the searching for any excuse for my rotten behavior. Something or someone was always to blame—the stress, the responsibilities, the changes. If you had my problems, you would drink, too!



Thank goodness that therapist didn't believe me. She gave me an ultimatum—go to A.A., or stop coming to see me. Tail between my legs, I went. I was scared, confused, and ashamed. I could not believe my life had come to this. I thought my life was over. I could not imagine how I could live without alcohol. I couldn't imagine how anyone could. I was stunned by the people I found there. Not a bunch of sour-smelling, rotting-toothed men in trench-coats, but smiling ladies offering a warm welcome, a genuine smile, and a friendly handshake.

It took a while to get through the Steps, but I did make it. I found a sponsor, I went to meetings; did what people told me, even if I thought it

was stupid. Slowly, my life began to change. I learned some humility, some honesty. I learned that when I am honest, I truly connect with others. I learned to pray, and to listen. I learned how to be a friend—something I had stopped practicing when I started my friendship with alcohol. I learned how to feel my feelings.

Alcohol is not a friend who likes to let go, though. She's still sneaking around, waiting for a weak moment, a soft spot. When I moved overseas and found the program to be completely different, it took no time at all for my alcoholism to start the sweet talk, "Ah, you're in France now," she said, "why not have some wine? No one in SF will ever know. The A.A. here sucks anyway; it's not your fault. Look at how happy those couples look over their chardonnays. One glass won't hurt..."

I thank God that the woman in SF taught me well. I thank God for my sponsor, who stuck with me through this period, while I re-learned the program. Living in a foreign country, I had to re-jigger my program, finding support online, upping my reading, and taking advantage of what A.A. there is here. Finding newcomers to support became a lifesaver for me. And the whole experience reminded me that I am not immune to my disease. As they say in the rooms, it truly is waiting for me in the parking lot, doing push-ups.
